## REGISTRATION

**ONLINE REGISTRATION:** Online registration is available on Black Pug.

**ROSTERS:** Once you have registered, please bring your unit roster at check-in.

Packs will be required to clean their respective restrooms prior to moving out on Sunday morning. Removing trash that is on the floor and leaving it better than we found it. Please remove the trash bags from each bathroom and place them outside the restroom

## UPON ARRIVAL

**CHECK IN:** Units will arrive at camp Friday evening beginning at 6:30 pm. Please proceed to Camp Headquarters upon arriving at TRC. *Please ensure you have completed health forms, A and B.* We will not take them from you, but they will check.

**UNIT CHECK-IN:** Adult leaders will check in with the Camp Staff with their attending pack roster and get their camp site assignments. Adults may drive the Scouts and equipment to the camp sites to unload. Vehicles will then need to be removed as quickly as possible to the parking area, ALL vehicles must be out of the campsite area by 9:30 pm.

**PARKING:** There is plenty of parking available for ALL vehicles and trailers. One vehicle with a trailer attached is allowed per unit. There is to be no parking at the campsites without a special need. If you have a special medical need please speak to the Camp Health Officer at checkin.

**MEALS:** Packs/families are responsible for their own food and cooking equipment. Pack meals will be served in the Pack's campsite.

**SETTING UP CAMP:** We will be stressing the Pack camping during this Cuboree so the packs should be self- reliant. With that in mind, the Cub Leaders should take charge of the units as soon as equipment and scouts are unloaded, It will be up to your leaders and scouts to work together to set up in the space allowed. Please remember not to dig any large holes as a part of your camp set up.

We will be putting around 50 people into campsites so please make sure to plan accordingly, Do not bring more equipment than your unit needs and make sure to share the sites courteously.

**ADULT LEADER MEETING:** Once the equipment has been unloaded, adult leaders are encouraged to join us at the dining hall for a leader meeting at 9:00 pm. We will go over the Event Schedule and answer any questions that volunteers might have for their assignment.

## **NOTEWORTHY INFORMATION**

### **SWIMMING**

No swimming at this time.

### **BE PREPARED**

While there are fire rings in each camp site, please remember that your unit may be sharing with at least one other pack. You should only use established fire rings. You can also use an above ground fire pit or charcoal grill for cooking and campfires you plan to have at your campsite. Please check the fire conditions sign upon arrival to Clements Scout Ranch. Open fires may be prohibited by the Camp Rangers, event, leadership, or Henderson County.,

### **TRADING POST**

This will not be open during our event.

### **SEVERE WEATHER**

Should severe weather hit the area during the week prior to the Cuboree, the Cuboree Chief will use the contact information from the Unit Registration sheet to communicate the status of the event to each Pack. The emergency shelter for severe weather during the campout will be the camp dining hall. Camp Staff will communicate the emergency signal to be used in case camp participants need to move to the dining hall facility.

### **HYDRATION**

Be Prepared, each adult and each youth should bring their own water bottle and other six essentials while at TRJ. There will be refill stations at each event location.

### **CAMPFIRE**

We will have a Campfire Saturday evening. We want each Pack to prepare a song or skit for the evening so that we can all have a fun time! Please have a unit leader assist in the vetting of the songs or skits as well and turn them in at lunch time to the event chair.

*A Cub Scout skit or song should be positive, respectful, inclusive, and fun, embodying the values of the Scout Oath and Law. It should build confidence, encourage teamwork, inspire creativity, and be suitable and enjoyable for participants of all ages, creating a welcoming and uplifting experience for everyone involved. Skits or songs should never include disrespectful, inappropriate, or harmful content that contradicts scouting principles or values, and they should not be wasteful of food or other resources.*
