## **Lion/Kindergarten**

Our Cuboree allows some parts of various Adventures to be completed while participating in our event. While the entire adventure may not be able to be completed, we have compiled a list of requirements your Scout may have the opportunity to complete. Please speak with your Den Leader/ Cub Master for how they would like to record completions.

•	Mountain Lion (Required): can be done while walking about the event and in preparation of the event.
	Requirement 1: Identify the <u>Cub Scout Six Essentials</u> . Show what you do with each item.
	Requirement 2: With your den, pack, or family, take a walk outside spending for at least 20 minutes exploring the outdoors with your Cub Scout Six Essentials. While outside, identify things that you see with your Lion adult partner that are natural and things that are manmade.
	Requirement 4: Identify common animals that are found where you live. Separate those animals into domesticated and wild.
•	Fun on the Run (Required): Can be completed at Space Invaders or throughout the day around the camp.
	Requirement 2: Practice handwashing. Point out when you should wash your hands.
	Requirement 3: Be active for 20 minutes
	Requirement 4: Practice methods that help you rest.  • Can be done at the museum (quiet activity) or at campsite
•	Lion Roar (Required): Can be completed upon arrival at the event, during day, or when leaving
	Requirement 4: With your Lion Adult Partner, demonstrate how to safely cross a street or walk in a parking lot.
•	Let's Camp Lion (Elective) Can be done in preparation for the event or by camping at our event
	Requirement 1: Learn about the Buddy System and how it works in the outdoors
	Requirement 2: Before going on the overnight campout, discuss what type of weather is expected and what type of clothes you should wear.
	Requirement 3: Pack up your Cub Scout Six Essentials for the campout.
	Requirement 4: Attend a council or district Cub Scout overnight camp or attend an overnight campout with your pack.

Pick My Path (Elective)
Requirement 2: Perform a Good Turn for another person.  This can be completed at any time at the event if the opportunity presents itself.  Go Fish (Elective)
Requirement 1: With your Lion adult partner, learn the rules of fishing safely.
Requirement 2: Draw a picture of the type of fish you think lives in the water where you are going fishing.
Requirement 3: Go fishing with your Lion adult partner.
Range and Target Activities
Slingshot: Lion Scouts must have their adult partner with them while at the slingshot range. NOTE: When the word 'demonstrate' is used in a requirement, a simple demonstration made by the Cub Scout showing their understanding will serve as meeting that requirement. Where the word 'discover' is used in a requirement, explanation accompanied by visual aids will serve as meeting that requirement. When appropriate, some demonstrations/discussions can be held away from the firing line. Each Cub Scout should do their best based on their physical abilities.
Requirements:
lacksquare 1) Identify and wear appropriate safety gear with the help of your adult partner.
lacksquare 2) Recite the safety rules for using a slingshot with the help of your adult partner.
lacksquare 3) Demonstrate proper range commands with the help of your adult partner.
$\square$ 4) Explore the parts of a slingshot and their proper usage with the help of your adult partner.
$\square$ 5) Discover the types of ammunition that may be used and types that may not be used with the help of your adult partner.
G) Shooting Requirements:
$\square$ Shoot 2 shots at a target. Repeat and do your best to improve your score.
Shoot at least 4 shots.
7) Discuss how to put away and properly store your slingshot and shooting equipment after use

## Archery:

As with all Scouting activities, Lion Scouts must have their adult partner with them while at the archery range.

NOTE: When the word 'demonstrate' is used in a requirement, a simple demonstration made by the Cub Scout showing their understanding will serve as meeting that requirement. When appropriate, some demonstrations/discussions can be held away from the firing line. Each Cub Scout should do their best based on their physical abilities.
