Scouts will be directed to the location of their specific merit badge during the introductory session. Check in will begin at 9:00 am and close at 9:30 am so that the Merit Badge University can begin promptly at 9:30 am.

Scouts must sign out with a leader before leaving to ensure accountability.

- ☐ Daypack
- ☐ Refillable water bottle labeled with scouts name and unit number
- ☐ Pencil/Pen (or a few)
- ☐ Notebook
- ☐ Class specific requirements as noted in the Merit Badge Offered Table on page 4 of this document.

Merit Badge Requirements:

Merit badge requirements used will be the most current, accurate, and official as listed at <https://www.scouting.org/skills/merit-badges/>. Youth should review the requirements for the merit badge they wish to take, prior to arriving on site. We strongly encourage youth to watch the videos to establish a baseline understanding of the material so they may more thoroughly participate in discussions during the event. Adult leaders and parents should realize and understand that participation and preparation by each scout is of the utmost importance. It is up to the discretion of the counselor to determine if scouts are prepared and participating in the class. The latest update to the Guide to Advancement (Jan 2025) states that a Scout MUST discuss with a unit leader or their delegate their intention to work on a specific merit badge BEFORE beginning the merit badge (GTA 7.0.0.3). Please ensure this is completed before registering for the event.

While our intent is to cover all the requirements for a merit badge with the exception of the items listed in the table above, we CANNOT 100% guarantee that all requirements will be completed and work may be required after the event. If so, the scout will need to share the completed work with the counselor in order for the requirement to be signed off as complete after the session they attend. They will receive contact information for the MBC during the event or may work with another registered counselor after the event to complete the Merit Badge. Remember when contacting merit badge counselors, always include a parent/guardian or Scoutmaster to your conversation in accordance with youth protection standards. After the MBU, the Scoutmaster of each unit in attendance will receive an email with a list of all requirements that were covered by the merit badge counselors in each session.

Conduct Code

As with other Scouting events, the use of alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, vaping or vape devices, illegal drugs, medical marijuana or controlled substances, firearms, sheath knives and fireworks are positively prohibited. Merit Badge University follows the Guide to Safe Scouting. Scouts are expected to follow the Scout Oath and Law.
