The Spring CNP will be aviation themed, so jet on over to the NWTC Black Pug (**LINK: <https://scoutingevent.com/587-65624>**) and get your Scouters registered for this event! Participants may begin checking in **NO EARLIER** than 6PM on Friday, 14 April 2023. Participants arriving before this time will be asked to return to their vehicles and wait until check-in opens.

Individuals registering after midnight on 31 March 2023 **WILL NOT RECEIVE T-SHIRTS - NO EXCEPTIONS**. Register early to make sure you and your Scout receive a T-shirt! Scouts will have the opportunity to screen print additional images on their shirts at the event.

## CHECK-IN PROCEDURES

All participants will check-in at the office located in the Perkins Scout Reservation Dining Hall. All participants will have the opportunity to have their gear transported to their campsite via truck/trailer should they so desire. NO vehicles are permitted past the gate immediately adjacent to the Dining Hall. units with trailers must drop them off prior to the event on Tuesday, 11 April 2023, or Thursday, 13 April 2023, from 5PM - 9PM respectively. Units wishing to do this must obtain prior approval from the 2023 Spring CNP Staff Adviser (Ms. Megan Sila) or the 2023 Spring CNP Chairman (Mr. Allen Pappas), so we may plan accordingly.

## REQUIRED FORMS

All participants (youth, adults, siblings, etc.) must present a completed and current (must be signed/dated on or after 14 April 2022) BSA Annual Health and Medical Record (**PARTS A/B ONLY**). The form must be accompanied by a photocopy of **BOTH** sides of the participant's insurance card. These forms will be returned to you at check-out. Youth participants (i.e. <18 years old) who elect to participate in shooting sports (BB Gun, Archery, Slingshot) during the NWTC Spring CNP **MUST COMPLETE** a NWTC Shooting Sports Waiver. Lions may only participate in Archery and Slingshots in accordance with BSA's Shooting Sports Manual and the BSA's Guide to Safe Scouting.

## CHECK-OUT PROCEDURES

All participants are encouraged to stay for the non-denominational worship service on Sunday morning. Check out will be no later than 10:00 AM Sunday. This allows event staff the opportunity to finish cleaning up camp and get home early enough to spend time with their families Sunday afternoon.

When preparing to check-out, please leave your camp site in the condition with which you found it in. Trash must be taken up the hill and placed in the dumpster past the dining hall. Fire rings, if utilized, must be returned to their designated location. Please return all gathered firewood to the designated area as well. An adult leader from each unit must pick up the unit's medical forms at the Medic's Office prior to leaving camp. Finally, a representative from each unit must check-out with event staff in the Dining Hall Office

## CAMP RULES

Please be aware of the following rules at Perkins Scout Reservation:

- Only registered participants are permitted at camp.
- The NWTC is **NOT** responsible for any loss or damage to personal property.
- Remove all personal property and put your trash in dumpster. Follow LNT rules. What you bring in, you bring out or dump in the dumpster.

- Quiet hours are from 10:00 PM to 6:00 AM. During this time, please refrain from any loud activities or noises. If a neighbor camper is disturbing you, please bring it to the Attention of a Staff Member.
- Use of fireworks or other explosives are prohibited (violators will be removed **IMMEDIATELY**).
- The possession or consumption of alcohol is prohibited (violators will be removed **IMMEDIATELY**).
- Use of tobacco, cigarettes, or vape products is prohibited (violators will be removed **IMMEDIATELY**).

## MEDICATIONS AND FIRST AID

A medical professional will be on-site for the duration of the event. Any medications that require refrigeration may be kept at the Medic's Office located at the Quartermaster Building. All such medications must be in their original container and be clearly labeled with individual's name AND unit number. Please remember to pick up all medications from the Medic's Office before you check-out on Sunday.

## BURN BAN INFORMATION

A county-wide burn ban may be in place during the event. Should this be the case, absolutely no fires of any type will be permitted during the event. Should the burn ban be lifted, please practice the following campfire safety measures when building/starting fires:

- Build fires **ONLY** in fire rings provided for the purpose, - **DO NOT** dig holes.
- Firewood must be small enough to fit inside the fire ring.
- Fire rings are the property of The NWTC and therefore, modifications to them are strictly prohibited.
- **DO NOT** put cans, bottles, plastic, food, or rocks in fire rings.
- **DO NOT** start campfires with gasoline or camping fuel.
- Keep flammable materials away from campfires.
- **DO NOT** leave fires unattended.

## TRADING POST

The Trading Post will be open Saturday from 12:00 PM (noon) until 8:00 PM. The Trading Post **WILL NOT** operate outside of these hours. Trading Post items may include but are not limited to: small snacks (chips, drinks, water, ice cream sandwiches, etc.), drinks, camp mugs, pocket knives, water bottles, and more!

## SEVERE WEATHER

The 2023 NWTC Spring CNP **WILL NOT BE CANCELLED** unless severe weather threatens the health and safety of our participants. Event staff will keep all participants informed in as timely a manner as possible via text/email based on the information you provide during registration. Please help do your part to **BE PREPARED** by keeping track of the weather forecasted for the event. Event staff are responsible for monitoring weather conditions via the National Weather Service and will ensure all appropriate steps are taken to ensure the health and safety of all participants should severe weather threaten the event. A briefing on severe weather procedures will be given during the Leaders Meeting on Friday night.

## MORNING STATION INFORMATION

**Archery:** Take aim out on the Perkins Scout Reservation Archery Range. Our qualified instructors will work with your Scout to help them give it their best shot!

**BB Guns:** Take aim out on the Perkins Scout Reservation BB Range. Our qualified instructors will work with your Scout to help them give it their best shot and take down our aviation-themed targets!

**Slingshot:** Take your skills over to the range and knock 'em down with our slingshots. Rumor has it the ammo for this event is not what you're expecting!

**Drone Racing:** Get behind the controls of RC drones and compete against your peers in a race like none other. Take your piloting skills to the next level by attempting the drone obstacle course.

**Aircraft Production:** Put your skills to the test and build your very own realistic aircraft and then FLY IT!

**Crash Landing:** Grab your very own paratrooper and use one of our AIR CANNONS to launch him or her to safety.

**Houston We Have Lift Off!:** Scouts will create their very own rocket and challenge each other for the highest flight and longest flight!

## AFTERNOON STATION INFORMATION

**Helicopter Landing/Demonstration:** The Wichita Falls Air Evac Team will land at Perkins Scout Reservation and talk to Cub Scouts about how their aircraft helps them do their job. Air Evac Team staff will be on-site to show Cub Scouts their helicopter and provide pictures opportunities!

**Rocket Building/Launching:** Cub Scouts can purchase (kit is \$5) a rocket kit and launch it during the afternoon. We will have qualified rocket-experts on staff to show different examples of model rockets and how they work, and rumor has it they'll even be launching a HUGE ROCKET sometime during the afternoon!

**RC Aircraft Experience:** Your Cub Scout will have the opportunity to fly a real remote-controlled (RC) aircraft courtesy of the Academy of Model Aeronautics. Highly trained adult instructors will be on-site to provide this experience for your Cub Scout.

**Morning Stations Will Be Open:** Did you Cub Scout have a BLAST at one of the stations offered in the morning? Want to head on down to the range, fly drones, or shoot your rocket into the wild blue yonder? Feel free to go back and participate in any of the morning stations on a first-come, first-served basis. Please understand that some materials are limited and once they are gone, they're gone!
