CHECK IN – begins at 5:00pm on Friday. **No sooner!** All participants will check in at the Dining Hall before parking for the weekend. After checking in, please park in the designated area; gear will be transported to campsites by trailer, and families may then set up their tents. **Please label your gear with Pack # and Last Name.**

CHECK OUT – will conclude by 10:00 am on Sunday. Please help us care for Camp Perkins by leaving your campsite in Leave No Trace condition. Trash may be taken to the dumpster located past the Dining Hall. An adult leader from each Pack and Troop must pick up the unit's medical forms at the dining hall prior to leaving camp.

Important to Know

1. **VOLUNTEERS** – Please be patient with our staff and BSA youth as they work to make this weekend amazing.
2. **ACTIVITIES** – We are excited to offer a variety of fun classic Scouting activities throughout the weekend, including: target and range activities, hiking, identifying animal tracks, learning knots and first aid, participating in a conservation project, and campfire s'mores. A full schedule and description of events will be shared during check-in and posted at the Dining Hall. *All activities subject to change due to unforeseen circumstances.
3. **SATURDAY EVENING ENTERTAINMENT** – We welcome songs, skits, and jokes for the campfire program! We encourage each Pack and Troop to participate in at least one. Please turn submissions in to the Camp Director by Saturday dinner. All material should be fun, positive, and Cub Scout appropriate.
4. **MEALS** – will be provided on Saturday (breakfast, lunch, and dinner) and Sunday breakfast. We encourage families to eat before arriving on Friday or bring a simple dinner with you. Feel free to pack snacks in daypacks for between-meal energy.
5. **INTERFAITH SERVICE** – We invite all families to join us on Sunday morning for our Duty to God Interfaith Service. A World Friendship Fund collection will be available for those who wish to participate

Suggested Minimum Personal Supply List:

- Shelter– tent, ground cloth, rain cover, hammer and stakes
- Sleeping gear – sleeping bag, blanket, cot or foam pad
- Personal gear – weather appropriate clothing, closed toe shoes, rain protection, hat, soap, towel, toothbrush, toothpaste, bug spray, mess kit and eating utensils
- 6 Essentials in a backpack – Sun and rain protection, personal first aid kit, **refillable water bottle**, trail snacks, flashlight and whistle.
- Camp chair

Pack Supply List: Group items – water jugs, lanterns, dining fly, folding tables, ice chest, American and Pack flags.

Rules and Regulations

1. **BSA Medical Forms (Parts A & B) are mandatory for everyone at camp and should be turned in as a Unit prior to check-in. Units must turn in their Medical Form binders to the Scout Office no later than March 13th to streamline the process.**
2. **VEHICLES** – Pack/Troop trailers may be brought to camp beginning Thursday March 18th and dropped off in your campsite. **Only unhooked trailers are allowed to remain in the camp area. There are NO vehicles past the gate except for camp staff.**
3. **NO ALCOHOL** – please report any concerns to the Camp Ranger or Staff Advisor so we can ensure a safe environment for all Scouts and families.
4. **SMOKING** – is permitted only at your parked vehicle. For the well-being of our youth, smoking should never occur in front of Scouts.
5. **PETS** – Scouting America generally prohibits pets at Scouting activities, with the exception of certified service animals.
6. **FIRE** – All fires must be contained in a raised container or an approved fire ring. Please do not destroy, pick, cut, or remove plants including trees, dead or downed wood, shrubs, or other member of the plant family.
7. **CLOSED TOE SHOES** – Closed-toe shoes are required for everyone at camp. Camp Perkins has grass burrs and uneven terrain, so sturdy walking shoes are strongly recommended.
8. **MEDICATION** – any medication requiring refrigeration may be stored at the Medic's Office. Please label items clearly with your Pack number and remember to pick them up before leaving on Sunday.
9. **WEATHER** – Cub-n-Pal will continue as planned unless severe weather is expected. Any updates will be shared through the Council website and email. Please come prepared for typical weather conditions and check the forecast before leaving home. Event leadership will remain in communication with the National Weather Service and will take all appropriate steps to ensure everyone's safety. Refunds are not issued for weather; registrations will automatically roll over to the next Cub-n-Pal event.
