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### What is Cub Scout Leader Pow Wow?

Pow Wow is an annual supplemental, action-packed training event for adults. You'll spend the day learning new ideas and concepts and having hands-on experiences that will enhance your ability to deliver and support a fun-filled, exciting program to Cub Scouts.

### Who should attend Pow Wow?

All registered adult Cub Scout Leaders, potential leaders, and interested parents. This includes all rank Den Leaders and Assistant Den Leader, Cubmasters and Assistant Cubmasters, Pack Committee members, activity/event chairpersons and anyone who wants to learn more about how to have a better Cub Scout program. Oh! And let's not forget Charter Organization Representatives, they need to come too.

Training sessions will be offered on relevant topics for every Cub Scout position and are designed to help you make your Cub Scout program more fun for the scouts ... and for you too! Pow Wow is a full day training event, and the course sessions are intended for adults only.

## Akela's Academy Youth Camp

Forget finding a babysitter, bring the whole family for a fun filled day of Scouting excitement! We are offering a mini-camp of engaging activities for Cub Scouts and their siblings. Activities include, science, nature, Scout skills, games, crafts, songs and skits and meet requirements for advancement and STEM Nova awards. There will even be a Tot Lot for the littlest scouters. Youth must be toilet-trained to attend camp. Cost is \$15 per child and includes lunch.

# How much does Pow Wow cost and what's included?

Pre-register on-line by Tuesday, October 3, 2023, for \$26.00. After midnight on Tuesday, October 3, 2023, electronic registration will end. There will be opportunities for walk-in registrations at the event for an additional \$10 charge. Walk-in participants will have a limited selection of classes. To get your preferred classes, Register Early!

The Pre-registration fee includes a day of training (as many as five courses), Blue and Gold lunch, an event patch, and as much scout fellowship, spirit, and networking you can take-in during the day!! It also counts toward Cub Scout Leader Award knots!

That's easy...wear your scout uniform (if you have one) but theme costumes will always work too!


Bring a water bottle, notepad & pen! Also, bring your Cub Scout Spirit and your BIGGEST smile.
