## General Information

**Age Appropriate:** Classes at Tidewater University are separated into different departments to identify program and age appropriateness. **Prerequisites:** Some classes have requirements that should be completed before arriving. Prerequisites are listed on the Class Schedules and the Class Catalogs. If none are listed, there are no prerequisites. If the prerequisites are not completed in advance, participating in the class is at the discretion of the instructor.

**Merit Badge & Certifications:** Some classes, such as merit badges and first aid certifications, have standardized requirements. Participants must fully participate in those classes and complete all requirements as written. The instructors do not have the ability to change these requirements.

**Class Sections:** Most classes are offered only once and have a section labeled A. Classes offered more than once will have additional sections labeled B & C. Participants should attend all periods for their class section.

**Seats:** Some classes have a limited number of seats. These are available by first signup. Exceeding the class limit is at the discretion of the instructor, although some standardized classes may impose a hard limit.
