# Medical Forms A, B and C



- Every youth and adult must have a completed current Annual Health and Medical Record. Anyone staying at summer camp must have Parts A, B, **and C** signed by a physician, PA or NP within the past 12 calendar months
- NEW THIS YEAR – We will be using HEALTHFORMS IO to digitally collect ALL health forms. **MUST HAVE EMAIL ADDRESS FOR EVERY PARTICIPANT IN BLACK PUG.** More info coming at the May Google Meet virtual meeting.
- **The medical form no longer allows attaching to another physical exam (e.g., a sports physical) to the Scouting America medical form. The physician's signature must be on the Scouting America form in order to be valid.**
- Participants who arrive at camp without a properly completed medical form will be sent home after 72 hours. This policy is strictly enforced.

# Arrival Process

- During May, each unit will receive an email with their campsite assignment and a 30-minute window for their arrival at camp and check-in procedures. Be watching for the email.
- Please do not arrive before the assigned time. If the scoutmaster realizes the unit will be late, call (540) 662-2551 to let us know and we will assign a new arrival time.
- We recommend that you pre-stage before arriving at camp, so everyone arrives at the same time. This will help prevent large groups from congregating in the camp parking lot during the check-in process.



# Arrival Process

A member of the camp management will meet you in the parking lot to review your roster, paperwork, and verify that all fees have been paid. Your unit will receive a camp map, fireguard plan, emergency procedures, and other essential paperwork.



## **Please have the following with you:**

- Unit Roster from [my.scouting.org](http://my.scouting.org) to confirm scouts/leaders attending are registered with Scouting America.
- Safeguarding Youth certificates printed for all adults.

Once you have completed registration the staff member will then assign you a troop guide who will help direct you to your assigned campsite. We ask that the unit minimizes the number of vehicles driving to the campsite. Follow the “direction of travel” signs on the road, and do not park in or block the roads throughout camp. One vehicle with a trailer may be parked at the campsite during your stay.

# Arrival Process

## CAMP ORIENTATION

Your troop guide will help you get through the orientation as quickly as possible. Once at the campsite, you will have time to begin setting up. A member of the camp management team will visit your camp site and they will cover the general camp information, program, schedules, and more.

## MEDICAL CHECK

Medical form checks will happen prior to your arrival at camp, using the new HEALTHFORMS IO system. Our medical officer will still be coming around to your unit to distribute swim tags, review any medical issues they may have questions about, and more.



# Arrival Process

## **AFTER YOUR CAMPSITE CHECK-IN AND HEALTH CHECK...**

Camp management will coordinate your arrival to the Dining Hall for an orientation session. T-shirt pre-orders will be delivered at this time. You will next transition to a Range and Target Activities Safety Review and Swim Check.



## **RANGE AND TARGET ACTIVITIES SAFETY REVIEW**

Everyone will participate in the RATA safety orientation while waiting for swim checks.

## **SWIM CHECK**

All campers (Adult and Youth) will visit the Aquatics Area on Sunday during their time slot to receive the safety talk and buddy tag. Swim tests will be available as needed during this time.

When possible, we encourage all units to conduct the required annual Scouting America swim classification test prior to arriving at summer camp.

# New Check Out Process

## **SATURDAY MORNING...**

Breakfast and your beloved coffee cart will be delivered to your campsite by 7am.

During your week you will select your check out time for Saturday morning. At the time you selected a troop guide will arrive to your campsite to do a final inspection and dismiss your unit from camp.

All Saturday morning programming that you are “used to” at Sinoquipe will happen during Friday’s programming.

Once your troop guide dismisses you, your unit is free to leave camp. All units must be departed by 9am.

- Bicycles in camp? Adults only and you must wear helmet.
- How do we submit names for OA Callouts? From page 24 of the leaders guide... SAC Scouts must be submitted to the Lodge Officer no later than the Thursday OA Social. Non-SAC scouts requesting a call out at SSR must provide a letter from their lodge chief/advisor with the names of the scouts/scouters to be called out preferably prior to coming to camp but no later than the OA social on Thursday.

# Notes from the live meeting that weren't covered in the powerpoint...

- Lakusin and Trailblazer requirements covered?
- Lakusin – see page 16 of the leaders guide
- In addition to the information in the leaders guide... We do not sign off scoutbooks in this program. We mark the requirement as completed in our online system, black pug, and we use the EDGE method in the Lakusin program. We explain on Sunday evening during the Lakusin orientation meeting that the summer camp staff will only mark completed what the scout has been explained, demonstrated, and guided in doing during their week at camp, it is then up to the unit/scoutmaster to determine when/if the scout has been enabled in that requirement. As mentioned during the google meet tonight scouts are distributed into patrols based on where they are in their scouting journey so there may be some blanks or not completed for your Lakusin scout in their after camp report because they did not do it during their week of camp. A Lakusin scout who comes to camp with their totin chit and firemn chip completed isn't going to get that marked off as completed because our staff isn't going to be working on that with them. Why would we when they've already earned it. Let's move on to first aid or something they haven't done yet. While this may create some unknowns for what exactly your scouts may be doing during their program we've found in the many years we have been doing the program that it is a great way to keep those first year Lakusin scouts actively learning and engaged during their time in the program.

First Class: 5a, 6a, 6b, 6c, 6d, 6e

# Notes from the live meeting that weren't covered in the powerpoint...

- Trailblazer 2<sup>nd</sup> year camper program
- The origination of this program is to provide a semi structured half day program for scouts who are new to camp but don't need the fully structured Lakusin 1<sup>st</sup> year camper program. We found that we had scouts signing up for the first-year program who were too advanced in either their maturity or skills but their leaders didn't feel they were quite prepared to be fully unleashed into a full day of merit badge classes. Thus, Trailblazer was formed. This program isn't rank requirement focused. It focused on leadership skills, patrol and edge methods, and confident skill building.
- **SOME OF THE SKILLS TRAILBLAZERS WILL WORK ON:** First Class Rank Requirements, Fire Building Skills, Dutch Oven & Outdoor Cooking Skills, Outdoor Scouting Skills, Leadership Skills, Pioneering, Orienteering, and First Aid.
- This program is also designed and adapted to work to the abilities and skills of the scouts that are in attendance. If half of us are working on first aid while the other half are doing dutch oven then that's what we will be doing based on the needs and desires of the scouts in attendance that week.
- Our goal with BOTH the Lakusin and Trailblazer program is provide THE SCOUT with the programming that they need and desire for their week at camp. Does this mean that Johnny Scout might have to duplicate learning basic compass skills because he is the only one who has already done it? Yes, maybe. But we are going to do everything in our power to minimize those circumstances and provide quality experiences.
