Bruce Y. Leaman earned his Eagle Scout award from Troop 13 in Kenilworth, Illinois in 1960. New career opportunities, transfers and promotions allowed him to serve as Scoutmaster or Assistant Scoutmaster with five different units and work in numerous District or Council positions in his 60 plus years as a registered Scout. Bruce has guided more than 75 scouts toward completion of their Eagle Scout Rank and has taken his Troops to scout camp over 14 summers. He served Cardinal District as District Commissioner, District Program Chair and was the annual Klondike Derby Chair, for five events. Bruce is Woodbadge trained and is a Vigil Honor member of Nawakwa Lodge, Order of the Arrow.

Indian Mounds District of Bay Lakes Council in Wisconsin honored Bruce with the District Award of Merit in 1976. He served on Staff at the 1981 National Jamboree and was the Philmont expedition leader in 1997. The Heart of Virginia Council recognized Bruce's outstanding service to scouting with the Silver Beaver Award in 1998. Bruce has received the Cross and Flame Award from the United Methodist Church, is an Eagle Society member and a James E. West Fellow. He and his wife Julia live in Henrico County and have two Eagle Scout sons.

Michael saw a need at the local elementary school for a pavilion to act as an outdoor classroom and shelter from the weather. He managed changes in the structural plans, recruiting both youth and adult volunteers and constructed the pavilion on two very hot days of work. In the end, the project came in under budget and provided a new facility for the Lawson-Marriott Elementary School.

Jerry's time in Scouting is a master's course in service leadership. His dedication and mentoring has made a lasting difference in Midlothian. Troop 897 was one of the smallest Troops in Midlothian for much of its history. Small but very active. The Troop was founded in 1988 and one of our eagle commencement committee members, Jeff Urban, is one of the first eagles from this Troop. Jerry took over the Scoutmaster role in 2008 and has grown the Troop since that time from 25 Scouts to over 65 in 2023.

Jerry has implemented a very strict boy run program and has helped foster a unique mentorship culture in the Troop that mirrors his own approach to serving others.

He is also super dedicated to providing a stellar outdoor program for his Scouts. Not only does his Troop have monthly outings, but he has also helped plan and lead high adventure Crews every summer since becoming Scoutmaster. He personally has completed the Grand Slam, which means that he has led a Crew to every high adventure base (Philmont, Northern Tier, SeaBase and Summit). This is a unique achievement with few Scouts in the country having completed it. This also shows Jerry's unique dedication to his Scouts as he has sacrificed many summers and vacation time to provide these experiences.

Jerry has dedicated hundreds of nights to camping and completed almost every training course available (Wood Badge in 2009). He has earned the Scoutmaster's Key twice and helped start a female Troop in 2019. While all of these things are worthy of honor, Jerry would tell you his biggest achievement is his work in helping youth reach Eagle. Jerry has been Scoutmaster for 15 years and has helped 52 Scouts reach Eagle. He has received over 20 Eagle Mentor pins from these Eagle Scouts for his service in helping them achieve the rank. We think this makes him uniquely qualified to be our 2022 honoree.

NESA Outstanding Eagle Scout Awardee, Charles Sullivan



The NESA Outstanding Eagle Scout Award or NOESA, is a prestigious recognition granted by the local council's National Eagle Scout Association's Committee on behalf of the national organization. It is presented to Eagle Scouts who have made a significant impact on their communities and demonstrated outstanding achievements at a local, state or national level. Recipient's actions and accomplishments should elevate the stature of Eagle Scouts in the public eye. Each recipient shall be held to the standards set forth in the Scout Oath, Scout Law, and national BSA standards for membership.

Chuck's career included several national and international sales director positions which had him traveling world-wide to generate annually, over 100 million dollars in spice and seasoning sales. He has brought to market many new products at major national and international companies such as Procter & Gamble - Pringles, Kellogg, Sara Lee, Jimmy Dean, Hillshire Farms, Unilever - Lipton, Bertolli's and Wish Bone, Papa Johns, and

Domino's, to name a few. During his work life, he was involved in the development and introduction of countless food products in many categories; meat, snack, bakery, salad dressing, and more. He has been instrumental in bringing to market nearly 50 flavors of Pringles alone, in the US, Europe and Asia.

In his community Chuck has served the United Methodist Church in a number of leadership positions for over 40 years. He currently serves as Treasurer of the Bishop's Foundation for the Virginia Conference United Methodist Church. He has received the Torch Award, God & Service and the Cross and Flame adult religious awards. He has served McDaniel College, his college alma mater, as President of the Alumni Association and received the Community Service Award.

His service to Scouting extends from pack to troop to council, and council to national committee. He has served as Pack Committee Chair, Scoutmaster, District Commissioner and Chair, Executive Board, Council Vice President, National Cub Scout Committee and the National Advancement Education Task Force. His Scouting adventures include seven National Jamborees, Philmont, Sea Base, and Wood Badge Scoutmaster.
