FEES & REGISTRATION:

\$20 per person, which includes all program materials.

A Meal Plan is also available and includes Saturday lunch and dinner and breakfast on Sunday morning for an additional fee of \$25 per person.

(Meal plan availability is limited.)

Registration opens Wednesday, January 31st at noon.

Registration will close on Wednesday, May 1st at midnight.

CANCELLATION POLICY: Full refunds will be given if registration is cancelled on or before close of business April 5th, 2024. Cancellations after April 5th until the week prior to the event, only the participant fee will be refunded. No refunds will be given on meal plan fees. A week prior to the event, there will be no refunds on meal plan fees and participant fee refunds will only be given for extenuating circumstances. Reasons such as vacation schedules, school events, and last-minute changes of mind are not acceptable reasons for refunds. Requests for refunds received after the event is over will not be honored. Camporee Rules

All Campers and Staff are expected to observe the BSA and camp policies as outlined in the event brochure and as follows:

These are the rules to make your stay at camp safe and pleasant. Scouting rules are designed for two reasons: #1 Safety and #2 To enhance your program experience.

The BUDDY SYSTEM: All Cubs should be with their adult partner at all times. Cubs are always in sight of an adult.

The Emergency Signal will be a siren. If it should sound, EVERYONE must report to the Dining Hall immediately.

Clean campsites are a Scouting way of life. Pick up hazards, trash, and store any “eatables” and “smellables” away from critters. Pack out your trash.

NO ONE, camper, adult, or staff may ride in the back of a pickup truck, even with a shell. Seat belts are to be worn by all passengers.

Vehicles are prohibited at your campsite except for dropping off your camping supplies. 30-minute passes will be issued as needed. All vehicles need to be removed from your site and parked in our lot by 11:30am on Saturday. Participants arriving after 11:30am on Saturday must plan to haul their gear to their campsite using a wagon or carrying it in by hand. There are no exceptions to this rule. Programming will not begin until all cars are parked in the lot.

All vehicles must be parked in the designated parking lot. Respect and follow these rules.

- Stay to the right around the Cub Adventure Camp circle.
- Camp-wide Speed Limit is 5 MPH, no vehicles in camp after lunch. No flames inside tents. Cubs do not handle matches or lighters.
- No liquid fuel is permitted; However, propane lanterns and appliances may be used by adults only outside of tents or sleeping quarters.
- Fires, only if there is no FIRE Ban and only in preexisting campfire rings. Never leave a fire unattended. No cutting or trimming of trees. Do not bring wood from outside camp!
- No sheath knives, axes, or hatchets for Cub Scouts.
- Drugs, alcohol, and firearms are not permitted on camp property.
- Use of tobacco products is prohibited in front of youth AT ANY TIME whether in buildings, tent, or program areas.
- Damaged equipment or tents must be paid for at check-out.
- A Scout is courteous. Be on time for group gatherings. Plan ahead and make the walk part of the plan. Respect other parents and Cubs camping near you and observe quiet time from 10:00PM until morning.

For 4th and 5th grade Scouts/Webelos, who would like to do the Climbing Tower, will need to register for a time spot prior to the event. A registration link will be sent out to the leaders/adults to those who have Scouts/Webelos who can participate in the Climbing Tower activity two weeks prior to the event.
