## **Buckskin 2025**

#### **Reminders and Fact Sheet**

- 1. All forms are to be returned, and all money paid no later than Monday, July 7th, 2025.
  - a. The office will reach out to anyone with pending course fee balances
  - b. Review, complete, and return the Personal Resource Questionnaire
  - c. Review, complete, and return the Equipment List Acknowledgement
- 2. The Buckskin Leadership Experience course begins at 2:00 pm on Sunday, July 20<sup>th</sup> and concludes at 1:30 pm on Saturday, July 26<sup>th</sup>.
- Plan to arrive for check-in and registration at Camp T. Brady Saunders (Administration Building) between 1:30 and 2:00 pm on Sunday, July 21st.
- 4. Scouts must arrive with a *copy* of their completed BSA Medical Form (Parts A, B, and C). This must be completed and ready to present at check in on Sunday.
- 5. All medications must be registered with the First Aid Staff Member at the time of check-in on Sunday. Please have medicines clearly marked with your name and the required dosage. Unused portions will be returned on Saturday.
- 6. Any special instructions or needs should be in writing and presented no later than check-in on Sunday (preferably communicated prior using the contact info below).
- 7. Wear your uniform to camp along with your troop neckerchief. (If your troop doesn't wear neckerchiefs, please bring a neckerchief slide at minimum.)
- 8. All gear must be carried into camp. It is best to have it all in your pack. Please do not plan to pack in a footlocker or trunk.
- 9. The packing list references 2 Class A shirts. Participants are in Class A uniform all day Sunday, from dinner time to lights out Monday through Friday, and again Saturday morning. During the day, participants wear Scouting appropriate Class C (leisure clothes.) The quantities of uniform shorts, shirts, and socks referenced above are a suggestion please do not purchase additional uniform shirts for Buckskin.
- 10. Scouts will be camping in canvas wall tents with platforms on most evenings. The lightweight tent on the packing list is used for an activity during the course.
- 11. Meals will be furnished, beginning with dinner on Sunday and concluding with breakfast on the following Saturday.
- 12. This is a very busy week; therefore, we discourage visitors during camp. There will be a daily mail service in and out of camp.
- 13. The course concludes on Saturday, July 26<sup>th</sup> at 1:30 pm. Any parent, family member, or leader wishing to attend the graduation ceremony is welcome (and encouraged) to do so. The graduation ceremony begins promptly at 12:45 pm on our Assembly Field and concludes in our Assembly Hall. We recommend arriving by 12:30 pm to provide time to walk to the ceremony. A Staff Member will be at the Camp Administration Building to provide directions.
