

## Bruce Leaman

Bruce Y. Leaman earned his Eagle Scout award from Troop 13 in Kenilworth, Illinois in 1960. New career opportunities, transfers and promotions allowed him to serve as Scoutmaster or assistant Scoutmaster with five different units and work in numerous District or Council positions in his 60 plus years as a registered Scout. Bruce has guided more than 75 Scouts toward completion of their Eagle Scout Rank and has taken his Troops to Scout camp over 14 summers.

He served Cardinal District as District Commissioner, District Program Chair and was the annual Klondike Derby Chair for five events. Bruce is Wood Badge trained and is a Vigil Honor member of Nawakwa Lodge, Order of the Arrow. Indian Mounds District of Bay Lakes Council in Wisconsin honored Bruce with the District Award of Merit in 1976. He served on Staff at the 1981 National Jamboree and was part of the Philmont expedition leaders in 1997. The Heart of Virginia Council recognized Bruce's outstanding service to Scouting with the Silver Beaver Award in 1998. Bruce has received the Cross and Flame Award from the United Methodist Church, is an Eagle Society member and a James E. West Fellow. He and his wife, Julia, live in Henrico County and have two Eagle Scout sons.



# Chuck Sullivan

Chuck's introduction to Scouting was when he joined Pack 440 in 1958, in Owings Mills, Maryland. He earned his Arrow of Light and bridged to Troop 440 in 1961, also in Owings Mill, Maryland. From this auspicious beginning Chuck moved on to be a Troop 440 Explorer from 1965 to 1968 and joined Explorer Post 289 in 1964. During his tenure as a Scout and Explorer Chuck served many roles; Lifeguard, Camp staff, attended the Jamboree in 1964 and most intriguing, served as a Ship Army Newspaper staff for the Scouts in 1966 where he traveled to and from Europe on Army Troop ships.

Chuck earned his Eagle Scout in 1965 and immediately went on to serve in a volunteer role from 1966 to this present day. If there is a role in Scouting outside of the professionals that come to mind, then Chuck wore that hat here in the Heart of Virginia Council, as the council is known today.

Chuck helped organize and found Troop 706 in Montpelier in 1983 after serving as Assistant Scoutmaster for Troop 700 in Ashland. For the next four decades Chuck supported Troop 706 and until this past June, Troop 709 boys and girls as Eagle Coach, Den Leader, Chartered Organization Representative, Committee Member, and Advancement Chair for the Council. The number of Eagle Scouts that can be associated with Chuck are too numerous to count though Chuck himself has coached over 80 Eagle Scouts during his tenure in Scouting.



At the Council level Chuck has spent those same decades volunteering, running, and providing leadership to many Chuck Wagon and Klondike Derby's, Merit badge counseling, District training, Silver Beaver committee, Adams Award selection committee, Camp program staff, and several stints at National Jamborees. To say that Chuck wore many hats in Scouting is truly an understatement that we cannot enumerate here due to our four-hour time constraint.

Chuck has received over 25 Scouting awards, from training awards as a Cub and Troop leader, to District awards, the Council's Silver Beaver in 1988, James E West Fellowship, numerous religious awards, God and Service, Torch award from Va Conference UMC, and Life Member United Methodist Scouters among a few. He has also been honored with the NOESA and NESAs awards. If you Eagles do not know these awards, I encourage you to look them up as the next step on your journey as Eagle Scouts.



Chuck also has been active in his church community in the classroom; Sunday School, on the stage; Theatrical plays, as a lay delegate to various conferences, Parish relations, youth counselors, many Committee chairs, and supporting Scout Sunday activities as needed.

Chuck had also been tapped at his graduation as a speaker at his alma mater; Western Maryland College and has served on numerous committees at his alma mater since 1996.

Again, even Topps does not have these many hats.

Chucks professional career is also an indication of when you want something done give it to a busy person. Chuck finally retired in 2017 and has not slowed down. His dedication to Scouting, his life and his family has been evident to anyone who has met Chuck.


## **Taylor Campbell, Troop 736**

Henrico County Animal Shelter had a growing need for enrichment structures to improve the physical and mental well-being of the animals in their care, as well as outdoor housing solutions for feral cats in the community. Taylor Campbell saw this as an opportunity to make a meaningful impact. She planned, led, and oversaw the construction of two elevated dog agility ramps, six large decorative animal fence displays, and four insulated feral cat homes to support the shelter's mission.

To fund the project, Taylor organized multiple fundraising efforts, including selling handmade crocheted pumpkins, launching a GoFundMe campaign, and securing donations from family and friends. She successfully raised more than \$1,100 and coordinated over 330 hours of planning and execution with youth and adult volunteers. Despite challenging weather conditions, including heavy rain and a tornado warning during installation, Taylor demonstrated resilience and leadership to ensure the project was completed safely and successfully.

In recognition of her outstanding work, Taylor has been selected for the Glenn A. and Melinda W. Adams Eagle Scout Service Project of the Year Award at the Council Level. Her project will now be submitted to the National Eagle Scout Association for consideration alongside other Council winners from Territory 15.


