Cub Scout/Webelos Adventure Weekends Frequently Asked Questions

Why are adults charged the same as Cub Scouts?

Adults and other participants that attend the Cub Adventure Weekends or Webelos Adventure Weekends will receive the same services and program as the Cub Scout does.

Do we need a medical form?

Yes, Boy Scouts of America requires medical forms from all participants (youth and adults) at any BSA activity. Given the length of the weekend only Part A is required which does <u>not</u> require a doctor's visit.

Do we need a tour plan?

Only if you arriving as Pack or Den. If families are attending as a family Tour Plans are not required.

What about food allergies?

Please list known allergies on the event registration forms.

What kind of activities are there for the youth participants?

The age appropriate activities are designed to be fun and challenging for all participants. The activities will be different from Cub Scout Resident Camp and Cub Scout Day Camp. This is the only venue that Cub Scouts can earn recognition from the new Cub Scout Shooting sports program. Adults will fully participate with their child or children in attendance.

When will the activities end?

Activities end with the closing campfire which ends at 5:30PM Saturday afternoon.

Can we leave early?

People can leave anytime however, fees paid will not be refunded.

Can my son's siblings participate in the program?

Yes, these weekends are intended for all family members that want to participate, do however all members attending, need to register for the weekend.

What do we need to bring?

If you are arriving Friday night you need to bring equipment for an overnight stay in one of the cabins. If you would like to bring a tent, sites will be provided for you to pitch your tent. This is Alaska in October and November, so please plan accordingly. Uniforms are encouraged but again, plan for the weather.

Do we need to arrive Friday night and if yes by what time? While there are activities planned for Friday night, you do not have to arrive that night. If you are coming out Friday night you should plan to arrive between 6PM-7PM. If you are arriving on Saturday, you should arrive at 7:30AM to register and have breakfast and be ready for the day's activities.

Will the activities be outdoor and will they help my son in is advancement? Many of the activities are planned to be held outdoors but again it is Alaska in October and November so dress appropriately. Some but not all of the activities can be used to earn rank advancement.

Do all the participants have to be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America? No, one member of your party needs to be a registered Cub Scout/Webelos.

Who will administrator medication to my son?

Medications will be dispensed by you or a leader from you Pack.

Do we have to register as Pack?

No, you can register as youth/adult, as family, as a den, or your entire Pack.
