

## Great Alaska Council Spring Camporee 2026 Seward Alaska Resurrection Bay Express Tour

Kenai Fjords Tours is proud to offer two tours to the Scouts and accompanying adult leaders attending the 2026 Spring Camporee in Seward Alaska.

### Tour Dates and Times:

- May 30<sup>th</sup>, 0830-1130
- May 31<sup>st</sup>, 0830-1130

Check-in prior to trip the departure at the Kenai Fjords Tours office in the Seward Harbor:

- 45 minutes prior to departure at 0745

Location of the Kenai Fjords Tours office and getting there:

- 1304 4<sup>th</sup> Ave
- The Forest Acres Campground is a short 0.9-mile 15-minute walk to the harbor office via sidewalks. A Scout is Physically fit.
- Parking is not available at the harbor office. Paid parking is available at either lot north or south of the harbor on the west side of 4<sup>th</sup> Ave.

Capacity per day:

- 100 passengers
- Please follow Scouting America's guidelines for accompanying Adult Leader numbers per Troop. Surplus adults will only limit the number of Scouts able go on the tours.

Cost:

- \$0.00 per passenger
- Free of charge

Booking Information needed:

- Legal First and Last Name for all passengers per Troop
- Ages of Scouts between the age of 2-11
- Please provide final names on the tour registration page (located on the Camporee registration page) by noon on May 26.

Be Prepared:

- Dress for the weather. It will be about 10deg cooler out on the water. Plan for rain. The best views are from outside the cabin on the outer decks.
- Class A Uniforms required. Show Your Scout Sprit!
- Bring Water and a snack
- Camera for photos
- Binoculars for viewing wildlife, optional
- If you think you might get seasick, please take your medication prior to arriving. The gift shop stocks the most common prevention remedies available. They should be used as directed prior to boarding the vessel. If you start feeling seasick while on tour, most remedies' effectiveness will be limited.

There will not be assigned seating on board, and you may need to share a table with another troop, so make some new friends.

Please remember that you are a guest on these tours and to always follow the Scout law while onboard the vessel. Especially:

- Curious to the Deck Hands and others onboard
- Kind to the wildlife, and the vessel
- Obedient to your leaders, Deck Hands, and the Captain. The Captain is in charge while you are on board, please follow his instructions. He is an Eagle Scout, and a Retired US Coast Guard Captain. Please give him your full attention and respect.
- Clean, the Deck hands work hard to maintain a clean and well taken care vessel. Please clean up after yourselves and sweep your seating area trash prior to departing the vessel. Absolutely zero trash is to be thrown overboard!
