Section I. Arrival

Friday Check-in: Campsites will be assigned. Check-in time is between 5-8pm on Friday evening. Please ensure your arrival time is roughly accurate in your registration by 3/18. We will meet you in the parking lot.

Saturday Morning Check in will be from 7-8:00 am in the dining hall.

Participants will receive an updated camp map and schedule at check-in.

Parking, Unloading of Vehicles & Trailers

On Friday, you will be able to drive near to your campsite to unload. Remove all vehicles to the main parking lot as soon as possible.

Saturday Event Parking: Park in the main parking lot. Vehicles parked along an edge of the lot should be backed in.

Saturday only campers: you'll be able to drive in and unload your gear if desired after 5pm

Things to Bring for Check-in:

- Updated Roster if any alterations to online registration are needed
- Current and complete Medical Forms (Parts A and B) for everyone in camp.
- Parent Permission Forms for Cowboy Action participation for all scouts aged 14+ (available on pg 6 and in online registration portal)

Medical Needs

Please ensure that all medical needs and conditions are listed in your online registration. If you have purchased lunch tickets, Dietary needs must also be updated in the online registration.

ALL participants must have Medical Form parts A & B with them upon arrival, per Scouting policy.

Use of Fischer Lodge

Fischer Lodge will be open and accessible throughout the weekend for restroom access, warming up and socializing.

Restrooms and Showers

Campsites and Ranges have porta-potties. The shower house near the chapel is open. The basement of Fischer Lodge has restrooms and a few showers. The shower house near the square cabins is also available.

SECTION III. Program Activities

Mandatory Safety Briefing

One Safety Briefing session will be offered: 8:30am on Saturday.

All scouts and any adults who wish to participate in afternoon open shoot MUST attend

Morning Course of Fire

Each Scout will receive a Course of Fire card during check in.

Course of Fire will include Shotgun, Rifle, Cowboy Action (age 14+ only) and Muzzleloading.

Archery and Tomahawks are open all day and are unlimited.

Scouts need not participate in all range activities but are highly encouraged to try all disciplines! Those who have not yet used all of their course of fire shots will get priority during open time.

Shotgun Beginners Only time

9-10am is reserved on the Shotgun range for Beginners only. This will allow us to provide a more streamlined process to support beginners in their very first shots on the range.

10-11am beginners will be accommodates as much as possible.

11am through the rest of the event: Beginners MUST have participated in a Beginners Only time.

Lunch Break

Those that purchased Lunch Tickets through their registration will receive their lunch ticket during check in. Proceed to Fischer Lodge for Lunch. Must present Lunch Ticket!

Units may choose to cook their lunch in their campsite or if cooking is not required (such as for a trail style lunch), units may choose to sit in Carbon Lodge.

Afternoon Open Ranges

For Scouts, all ranges EXCEPT shotgun and Cowboy Action are open and free. Shotgun and Cowboy Action tickets may be purchased in the trading post.

For Adults, all ranges require tickets purchased from the Trading Post and are priced as follows:

- * .22 Rifle: \$1 for 10 shots
- * Cowboy Action: \$4 for 1 round
- * Muzzleloading: \$1 for 2 shots
- * Shotgun: \$3 for 5 shots or \$15 for 25 shots
- * Tomahawks, Archery and Sporting Arrows: Free

Scouts will be prioritized on ranges before Adults however unless a scout is working on a Marksmanship program or Merit Badge targets, they will be asked to rotate when other participants are waiting.

If you purchase shooting tickets during this event and are unable to redeem them, please return to the trading post for a refund. They cannot be honored at future events.

SECTION IV. Other Notes

Final Updates

All participants will receive updated schedules, maps, etc at check-in. Ranges may be added or modified due to volunteer personnel, weather and light conditions day-of or as needed. These updates will be communicated during the safety briefing or morning announcements.

Trading Post

Located in the lower level of Fisher Lodge, the trading post will be stocked with snacks and Scouting Gear! All range tickets will be available in the trading post to purchase all day. We are equipped to accept cards and cash in the trading post.

Event Patches

Participants should receive patches at the event. Extra patches will be made available for purchase in the trading post. If patches arrive late, patches will be made available at the council office post event.

DO NOT BRING

- Pets (other than licensed service animals)
- Personal firearms and archery equipment
- Personal watercraft
- Tobacco products, including Vape pens
- Illegal drugs and alcohol
- Fireworks
- Chainsaws

COWBOY ACTION SHOOTING PROGRAM

PARTICIPATION AND HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

Inland Northwest Council will be conducting a Scout cowboy action shooting program. In this program, Scouts will shoot a rifle, pistol, and shotgun under the supervision of an NRA Range Safety Officer and NRA certified instructors. Scouts will be required to wear eye protection and hearing protection at all times while on the range. Scouts are expected to abide by all safety rules and the instructions of the Range Safety Officer(s) and rifle, pistol, and shotgun instructor(s).

I, the undersigned, give my child, _____, permission to participate in this program. I understand that participation in the activity involves a certain degree of risk. I have carefully considered the risk involved and have given consent for my child to participate in the activity. I understand that participation in the activity is entirely voluntary and requires participants to abide by the rules and standards of conduct. I release the Boy Scouts of America, the local council, the activity coordinators, and all employees, volunteers, related parties, or other organizations associated with the activity from any and all claims or liability arising out of this participation.

For safety, my child and I agree that he/she will do the following or he/ she will be removed from the program. I understand that any additional cost associated with participation in this program will not be refunded if my child is removed for not following the rules below.

1. Complete a range safety briefing.
2. Wear all safety gear at all times while on the range.
3. Follow all the safety rules provided in the briefing.
4. Follow the instructions of the Range Safety Officer(s) and rifle, pistol, and shotgun instructor(s).
5. Do not handle the firearms until instructed to do so by the instructor(s).
6. **Is 14 years of age, or 13 and has completed the eighth grade,** as of the start of the class and will be in full compliance with all local, state, and federal guidelines, including age restrictions and original equipment manufacturer standards.
