FEEES & REGISTRATION

Early Bird Registration (*ends 5/7*) - \$25/youth and \$15/adult

Regular Registration (*ends 5/21*) - \$30/youth and \$20/adult

Late Registration (*begins 5/22*) - \$35/youth and \$25/adult

Saturday Night Camping - \$2/person

Packs are encouraged to register as a contingent, but individual registration is open. Camping is available to registered Cub Scouts and Leaders, and Cub Scout parents.

CANCELLATION & REFUND POLICY

The Inland Northwest Council's refund policy has been established to better control and account for funds during event or camp close-out reports. The Inland Northwest Council retains final decision authority on all refunds.

For cancellations because of medical reasons, a medical certificate is requested, and fees may be waived. For cancellations because of family emergencies – a death in the family or a major unseen event, a statement from the family is needed, and fees may be waived. If, for any reason, a participant youth or adult is removed for cause, violation of camp rules, or fails to provide any required medical forms or registration documentation, there will not be any reimbursement.

Requesting refunds is the responsibility of the unit leadership. For activities such as day camps, camporees, klondikes, and recognition dinners, the refund request must be coordinated **IN WRITING** with the council staff advisor or council service center within 72 hours of the event.

Note for Youth Registrations: Being sent home for cause, disciplinary action or changing your mind about attending does not constitute a reason for a refund.

Again: The Inland Northwest Council retains final decision authority on all refunds.

Cooking Pots/Pans/Utensils
Food for Saturday Dinner & Sunday Breakfast
Dish Cleaning Supplies

Pets (other than licensed service animals)	Personal Watercraft

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Do we have to pre-register, or can we walk-in?

Registration is required for us to ensure food, facility and program needs are met.

What age must a child be to attend?

All activities are available for youth currently enrolled in grades Kindergarten through 5th grade. BB Guns have an age minimum of 6 years old to participate.

Does my child have to be a registered Cub Scout to attend?

No, we encourage you to attend our day camp to see what Cub Scouting is all about! If your child is not a registered Cub Scout, a parent/guardian must be in attendance.

Is this a drop-off event?

No, all non-Cub Scouts must be accompanied by a parent/guardian for the duration of the event.

Who can camp overnight?

Overnight camping is available to all currently registered Cub Scouts, their parents, and their registered leaders.

Will my scout be able to earn adventures at the stations?

Yes, in the "Lab Notebook" (handed out at check-in), there will be a list of adventures for each rank that the station correlates to. It will be the parent's and/or leader's responsibility to record that for their scouts.
