### **Planning Committee Considerations**

- Scoutmasters If your Troop is going, have scouts involved with Crew/OA/other... register with your unit
- Camporee Planning Committee
  - Update Registration Info On-line with what to bring
  - Continue coordination with selected vendors to provide resources for fabricating awards for Patrol & Individual Events
    - Provide a list of recommended designs
    - Provide a no-later-than time to completion and pick-up
  - Develop the Patrol Evaluation Task List
    - Ensure that the list targets all individuals within the patrols if achievable
    - Must emphasize referencing the Scoutbook (i.e. morse code)
    - Staff as many grading stations as early as achievable
  - All Range Operations
    - Performance measures
    - Safety Standards
    - Where to take place
  - Coordinate for Sound System on Parade Field during Large Games
  - Receive up to 50 Bales of Hay
    - Pick up from source location
    - Return to neighboring farm location
  - o See if local farmers would be willing to donate pumpkins to BSA
  - Cider Press + donated apples
  - Develop system to assign Available Camp Areas maintaining division between genders
    (Boy Troops; Girl Troops; Linked Troops; Blended Troops)
  - Coordinate with Tricia Salazar for Brannon; Shaun; Joe; Tom to receive updates on registration numbers
  - o Confirm Cabins will be available for Staff & Campers with Special Needs
  - Get Costume Requirements out to Scouts through registration portal and distribution channels





- Task to Troops
  - o Can arrive as early as Friday Night
    - Official Start is Saturday morning
    - Food is on Troops
    - Time to perform TTFC Training & PL/SM Reviews
  - Bring Dutch Ovens and prospective tools(tongs; spatulas; spoons; heat barriers; etc... if you have them (the Chief Quartermaster has Dutch Ovens to supply if none are available at Troop level)
  - Troops bring what your Patrols choose for all breakfast meals to "Cook As A Patrol" or "Cook As An Individual"
  - o Bring Halloween Décor to participate in Haunted Trail Decorating Contest
    - Portions of the trail will be assigned to Patrols/Troops for decorating
    - Illumination is encouraged for viewing during the evening events
