NOAC 2024's theme "Reaching New Heights" is seen in this three patch set as your eyes follow the Snallygaster, a cryptid from West Virginia and Maryland, and Bucky Beaver, our Lodge's mascot, on their journey up to space! Starting at the bottom in the mountains, then heading up to the sky during sunset, and finally reaching space, the progression of this story is certainly a unique one!

For those interested in ordering and maybe those not yet entirely convinced here are some of the patches features (*Features are subject to vendor approval as they have not yet been confirmed by the vendor themselves, but were asked of the vendor)! In the space patch, the comet, the stars, and the sclera of the Snallygaster will glow in the dark! The UFO will be metallic, and participants (ONLY the people going to NOAC) will receive a special patch set, one with a purple border! A little bit more about the creators and designers, Charlie LoPinto-Ludas and Lorelei Namsupak, created this patch originally with the idea of including Mothman, a log, and a chief.
