



National Youth Leadership Training 2024

What is National Youth Leadership Training?

National Youth Leadership Training is a program of the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America, delivered to youth by the local BSA Council. The Bay-Lakes Council's traditional NYLT course is a 7-day, 6-night experience. The Bay-Lakes Council also offers a slightly longer NYLT course called Pack and Paddle, presented in a wilderness trek setting. Both courses feature personal development and leadership skills for youth in an outdoor setting and camping format. Both courses are conducted using the national standardized syllabus, under the leadership of quality program-trained volunteers.

What are the course objectives?

The National Youth Leadership Training course will empower participants:

- to be tomorrow's leaders today.
- to lead themselves; that they may serve others by leading them.
- with the confidence and knowledge to run the unit program.
- with a working knowledge of the skills needed for leadership.
- by preparing them to relay skills learned to others in their home unit and beyond.
- by providing the opportunity to share ideas and experiences with youth from other units.
- by creating a model troop for the participants to experience the BSA at its very best.

Who is qualified to attend?

The NYLT course trains youth from Scouts BSA Troops, Venture Crews, and Sea Scout Ships. The Course is co-educational. Male and female Scouts, Venturers, and Sea Scouts are all eligible and encouraged to attend. Participants **must** be at least 13 years of age by June 16, 2024. Participants do not have to be serving currently in a leadership role but should have the skills and abilities to do so in the future. Certain outdoor skills are needed to attend the course: tent set-up and takedown, preparing and eating meals out of doors, and general camping procedures. The participant should have slept overnight in a tent prior to attending NYLT. Participants must have sufficient maturity to function in a team or patrol of individuals they have not previously met. Additionally, each participant's Unit Leader must approve the participant's preparedness for NYLT as noted in the "Unit Leader's Role" below.

The Unit Leader's Role (Your Home Troop Scoutmaster, Crew Advisor, or Ship Skipper)

We expect the Unit Leader to work with participants prior to the course to provide them with an understanding of the basics of leadership. "Introduction to Leadership Skills" training, conducted at the unit level, is a prerequisite for NYLT. The Unit Leader must sign the "Unit Leader's Approval" form certifying the participant's preparedness for this course.

Registration Information

Register online at <https://scoutingevent.com/635-NYLT>. The course fee is \$300, but an early discount price of \$280 is available if paid in full by April 13, 2024. Registration ends on May 13, 2024. *Payments are transferable but not refundable.* The fee includes an NYLT hat, 2 t-shirts, council shoulder patch, "NYLT Trained" patch, temporary pocket patch, other course and training materials, meals from Sunday dinner through Saturday breakfast, loads of challenges and lots of fun. Space is limited to the first 48 paid participants. History shows us that our NYLT courses fill up fast, so register as soon as you are able, to avoid the waiting list.



How is the course set up?

The NYLT course, in the span of a week, models a month of meetings and activities of two linked Scouts BSA Troops, for male and female Scouts. Volunteer adults and youth hold troop leadership positions such as Scoutmaster, Assistant Scoutmaster, Senior Patrol Leader, Quartermaster, etc. Participants are formed into 6-person patrols, and take turns performing the leadership functions necessary for them to successfully work as a team to complete the intensive National Youth Leadership Training syllabus. Behavior expectations adhere rigidly to the Scout Oath, Scout Law, and Outdoor Code.

Uniform Requirements

One full Field uniform is required, and two are recommended. The Field uniform consists of your BSA uniform shirt, BSA pants/shorts, BSA belt, and BSA socks. The Field uniform is recommended for travel, and is required at camp for opening and closing activities. Much of the time, the uniform of the day will be Activity uniforms consisting of NYLT hat, t-shirts, belt, and Scout or Venturing pants or shorts. An NYLT hat and two t-shirts will be provided as part of registration fee.

The Patrol Method

The patrol method is used exclusively during the course. Participants will work within their patrols to set up campsites, cook meals, construct team projects and plan and carry out other activities without direct adult supervision. Patrol leadership changes daily to give all youth a chance to be a Patrol Leader or an Assistant. This provides hands-on opportunities for each youth to grow in leadership. It does require that each youth be mature enough to handle the independence given.

Orientation


If you have not already done so, complete the online registration at <https://scoutingevent.com/635-NYLT>

Mark your clothing with your name, even any parts of the official uniform which you borrow from someone, so you have a means to identify it, IF your patrol launders its uniform shirts and pants. This has happened in the instance of clothing being soaked or soiled due to weather issues.

ALL PARTICIPANTS MUST ARRIVE IN OFFICIAL SCOUT UNIFORM (the first four items in bold print on the required list). Scouts will be in uniform for the whole week. A pack or framed backpack must be used for getting gear from the parking lot to the campsite. Participants must not use suitcases, footlockers or trunks at the campsite. Normal prescribed patrol equipment will be issued.

BEFORE COMING TO CAMP PLEASE SEE THAT ALL BADGES AND INSIGNIA ARE PROPERLY SECURED ON YOUR UNIFORM.

Note: If you borrow uniforms from another Scout, you do not need to replace their badges with yours.

Code of Conduct

The Scout Oath, Scout Law and Outdoor Code form the basis for all behavior at NYLT. The Participant should read each item and sign to indicate their pledge and agreement to conduct themselves in accordance with these standards.

Scout Oath: On my honor, I will do my best to do my duty to God and my Country and to obey the Scout Law; to help other people at all times; to keep myself physically strong, mentally awake and morally straight.

Scout Law: A Scout is Trustworthy, Loyal, Helpful, Friendly, Courteous, Kind, Obedient, Cheerful, Thrifty, Brave, Clean, and Reverent.

Outdoor Code: As an American, I will do my best to: Be clean in my outdoor manners. Be careful with fire. Be considerate in the outdoors. Be conservation minded.

STANDARDS

- I agree to exhibit conduct and behavior that is consistent with the Scout Oath, Scout Law, and Outdoor Code.
- I agree to follow all directions of NYLT staff members, Camp Hiawatha staff, or their agents.
- I agree to use Scouting equipment safely and appropriately. If I damage or lose Scouting equipment due to neglect or misuse, I may be required to pay for repair or replacement of the equipment.
- I understand that serious or repeated failure to live up to this pledge may result in the necessity that I return home prior to the end of the stated activity.
