


KLONDIKE DERBY LEADER'S GUIDE

ADULT LEADER CHILI COOK OFF

This year we are bringing back the adult chili cook-off! Each troop can submit one entry as long as 2 leaders are with the Klondike patrols. Each unit is responsible for their ingredients, Dutch ovens, charcoal, cooking utensils, chimneys, etc. bowls, spoons and a secret ingredient will be supplied.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Registration Location

Please follow the signs to the Klondike Registration area once you arrive in camp. Please park vehicles and register at the North side of camp at the Visitor Welcome Center.

Camp Code of Conduct

All adults and youth shall follow the Scout Oath and Law at all times and must listen to staff. Two-deep leadership must be maintained at all times. All adults need current Safeguarding Youth Training.

Roster

A complete roster must be filled out with all youth and adults in attendance and turned in at check in, the unit should also keep a copy with the patrols during the event.

Med Forms

Please bring complete A & B Medical Health forms for each scout. They stay with your unit. **Please notify at Check-In if anyone has any allergies or carries an Epi-Pen. (See "Allergies" below.)**

Bathrooms and Garbage

Bathrooms are located at the Train Station & Welcome Center and will be available all day. Garbage cans will be located at the Train Station for all garbage and recycling needs.

Knives:

Fixed blade knives will not be allowed at any Scouting event. Knives 3.5" or less will be allowed and scouts may be asked to provide a Toten Chip.

Liquid Fuels

All use of any liquid fuel is prohibited, and if seen will result in an immediate ejection of the unit from the event.

Alcohol and Tobacco

Alcohol, Tobacco and any Drug use will not be tolerated, and will result in the immediate removal from the event.

Transportation

Units should plan to arrive together, with as few vehicles as possible. **We are requesting that scout trailers be left at home**, unless you plan on staying the night. If camping, trailers must stay in the parking lot until needed for your unit's Polar Bear Campout.

Polar Bear Camping

We encourage all units to partake in the Polar Bear Camping that is offered Saturday night. The unit will be responsible for their own meals (Saturday dinner and Sunday breakfast.) Contact Celina Smith at Bay-Lakes Council for registration details. Camp is already very full, but space is still available in some of the camping areas.

Lunch

Each unit is asked to bring two cans of **Tomato Based** soup per scout, (SpaghettiOs, Ravioli, Tomato Soup, etc. to be used in our Traditional Brotherhood Soup. What is not used will be given to the winning unit for donation to their local food pantry. Pulled Pork sandwiches, chips and a dessert will also be served.

Allergies

Dishes

Each unit needs to bring either a mess kit for each participant (or plates, bowls, silverware, and cups) for lunch. Let's Go Green for our events!!!

Klondike Events

Each event will be composed of a skill from Scout up to First Class, so make sure your scouts know their skills as they are incorporated into each event. Events this year include: Service Project, Fire Building, Shelter Building, Knots and Lashings, Cooking, First Aid, Orienteering, Archery, Sled race (if there is snow) or a game (if no snow.)

Proper Clothing

All participants are required to dress for the weather and have proper footwear. **Any Scout without proper footwear will not be allowed to participate in the events.** The Klondike goes on even if it is snowing, raining, or starts off with below 0 temperatures.

What to Pack on Sled

Sled, kettle and pot, wood, fire starter, drinking water, troop/patrol yell, patrol flag, lashing rope, first aid kit and supplies (poles/blanket for a stretcher), work gloves, snow shovels, clipboard, paper, pencil, Troop/Patrol Roster, Tarps, Mess Kits, Compass and Scout Spirit.

First Aid

All injuries must be reported to the event Health Officer right away, they will be located at the Train Station.

Trading Post

Beshkno Chapter will have a Trading Post set up in the Train Station. Soda and Candy will be for sale at the Trading Post throughout the day.

Service Project and Sled Race

The Klondike Sled Race and Service Project will be built into the scheduled event rotation.

Event Rotation Schedule
