- Class Description
 - Become a numismatist! In this session, Scouts will explore the history, art, and manufacturing of money. We will learn how the U.S. Mint produces billions of coins, how to identify mint marks and designers' initials, and how to safely store and preserve a collection. We will also dive into the various modern circulating commemorative programs, including the 50 State Quarters and the new American Women Quarters. By the end of this class, Scouts will understand how to "read" a coin's story and how to start a collection that could last a lifetime.

 - a. Using a spreadsheet or database program, develop a food budget for a patrol weekend campout OR create a troop roster that includes the name, rank, patrol, and telephone number of each Scout. Show your counselor that you can sort the roster by each of the following categories: rank, patrol, and alphabetically by name.
 - b. Using a word processor, write a draft letter to the parents of your troop's Scouts, inviting them to a troop event.
 - d. Using a presentation software program, develop a report about a topic approved by your counselor. For your presentation, create at least five slides, with each one incorporating text and some type of visual such as a photograph or an illustration.
 - e. Using a digital device, take a picture of a troop activity. Send or transfer this image to a device where the picture can be shared with your counselor.

- f. Make a digital recording of your voice, transfer the file to a different device, and have your counselor play back the recording.

During this class, we will be interacting and discussing what we have learned in preparation for the class. Remember the Scout Motto “Be Prepared” to guide you in preparation for this class.

Class Preparation

All scouts must read the Engineering Merit Badge Pamphlet in preparation for the class. A lot of good information is included that will help you with your pre-requisites. Available at the scout shop, your local troop, or online.

Class Pre-Requisites

Requirement 1. Select a manufactured item in your home (such as a toy or an appliance), and under adult supervision, investigate how and why it works as it does. Find out what sort of engineering activities were needed to create it. Discuss with your counselor what you learned and how you got the information.

- Try to choose something smaller that you can bring with you to class.

Requirement 2. Select an engineering achievement that has had a major impact on society. Using resources such as the Internet (with your parent's permission), books, and magazines, find out about the engineers who made this engineering feat possible, the special obstacles they had to overcome, and how this achievement has influenced the world today.

- You will share with the class. Bring a photo to share with the class. I will have a laptop if you bring information on memory stick.

Requirement 3. Explain the work of six types of engineers. Pick two of the six and explain how their work is related. Bring you two types and share with the class.

- Be prepared to discuss with class.

Requirement 7. Explain what it means to be a registered Professional Engineer (PE). Name the types of engineering work for which registration is most important?

- Be prepared to discuss with class.

Requirement 9. Find out about three career opportunities in engineering. Pick one and research the education, training, and experience required for this profession. Discuss this with your counselor, and explain why this profession might interest you.

Note: As this class will be open discussion, Scouts that have NOT read the Merit Badge pamphlet or completed the pre-requisites may be excused from the Merit Badge class.

 - Requirement 2
 - Explain to your counselor why having good skills in the following areas is important for an entrepreneur: communication, planning, organization, problem solving, decision making, basic math, adaptability, technical and social skills, teamwork, and leadership.
 - Requirement 3
 - Identify and interview an individual who has started his or her own business.
 - Learn about this person's educational background, early work experiences, where the idea for the business came from, and what was involved in starting the business.
 - Find out how the entrepreneur raised the capital (money) to start the business, examples of successes and challenges faced, and how the business is currently doing (if applicable).
 - Discuss with your counselor what you have learned.

 - Think of as many ideas for a business as you can, and write them down.
 - From your list, select three ideas you believe represent the best opportunities.
 - Choose one of these and explain to your counselor why you selected it and why you feel it can be successful.

Inventing

 - *If scout knows someone that they would like to interview, please do so.*
 - *If scout does not know someone, MB Counselor holds 13 patents and will be available for scouts in completing this requirement on course.*
 - 2b - Read about three inventors
 - Select one you find most interesting tell what you learned
 - 3c - Examine your scouting gear and find a patent number on a camp item you have used
 - With parental permission use the internet to find out more about that patent
 - 5 - Choose a commercially available product that you have used on an overnight camping trip with your troop
 - *Just choose an item.*
 - *We will complete balance on course with scouts idea.*
 - 6 - Think of an item you would like to invent that would solve a problem for your family, troop, chartered organization, community, or special interest group.
 - Talk to potential users
 - Write a proposal about the invention and how it would solve a problem
 - Proposal should include a sketch of invention
 - 7 - Build a working prototype of the item you invented for requirement 6*, then test and evaluate the invention. Among the aspects to consider in your evaluation are cost, usefulness, marketability, appearance, and function
 - Before you begin building the prototype, you must share your design and building plans with your counselor and have your counselor's approval
 - *Maintaining 2 Deep leadership scouts (or their leaders may forward) their notes from #6 and prototype plan with counselor prior to building prototype*

before course. Idea and prototype must be something scouts can safely build. Please budget time wisely.

- 8 - Do one of the following:
 - A - Participate in an invention, science, engineering, or robotics club or team that builds a useful item. Share your experience with your counselor
 - B - Visit a museum or exhibit dedicated to an inventor or invention, and create a presentation of your visit to share with a group such as your troop or patrol
- 9 - Discuss with your counselor the diverse skills, education, training, and experience it takes to be an inventor
 - Discuss how you can prepare yourself to be creative and inventive to solve problems at home, in school, and in your community.
 - Discuss three career fields that might utilize the skills of an inventor

 - Note cards can be used for speeches, but scouts should try to practice all speeches so they can make consistent eye contact with the audience and not just read a speech.

If your school doesn't use grades and only uses standards-based grading, scores must indicate meeting or exceeding standard). The most recent official semester report card must be shown. OR Show that for one term or semester you have improved your grades over the previous period. Most recent report cards must be shown.
 - Requirement 3: Get a note from the principal of your school (or another school official named by the principal) that states that in the past year your behavior, leadership, and service have been satisfactory. If you are home schooled or your school environment does not include a principal, you may obtain a note from your counterpart such as your parent.

 - Scouts must be First Class rank or higher.
 - Each Scout will be provided a model rocket kit specifically assembled and designed for this event. Please follow assembly directions closely. No other rocket kits will be allowed or launched. Kits will be made available upon event registration closure. A fully assembled rocket is to be brought to the event. Classroom time and schedule variability will not allow for rocket kit assembly.
 - Space Exploration MB will be launching the rockets twice as required unless winds start to exceed 20 mph as measured in the parking lot area at time of launch. Scouts must come prepared for the event weather in which we will be outside for probably 90 minutes, if you are not prepared you will not be launching

and will not complete the merit badge during the session. Safety and preparedness are key for this merit badge in all aspects.

- As a reminder in the prerequisites, they should be thoroughly completed and represent the work requested. In other words, stick figures and a few drawn lines do not constitute a site plan and research items should be fully completed and thought out (just like schoolwork assignments). Each participant will be sitting with an adult to review their individual prerequisites and should be capable of explaining the ideas, concepts, and research.
