Ledge to Lakes District Pinewood Derby Rules

- 1. Width (including wheels, axles and anything affixed to the vehicle) shall not exceed 2-3/4".
- 2. Length (including anything affixed to the vehicle) shall not exceed 7".
- 3. Height (including anything affixed to the vehicle) shall not exceed 3-1/2".
- 4. Weight shall not exceed 5 Ounces as determined by the official scale.
 - a. Weight may be added prior to Pack registration, but not after racing starts.
- 5. Width between wheels shall be no less than 1-3/4".
- 6. The axle nails shall be firmly affixed to the wood of the car body and MUST be placed in the original axle grooves in the supplied wooden block.
 - a. Wheelbase must be between 4-3/8" and 4-5/8". No extended wheelbases.
 - b. Distance between the rear of the car and the rear axle can be no less than 13/16".
 - c. Aftermarket or pre-cut kits are not permitted.
 - d. Aftermarket axles are not permitted. (A magnet test will be performed, the axles in the kits are magnetic, most aftermarket are not.)
 - e. Aftermarket wheels of any kind are not permitted.
 - f. Burrs on wheels and axles may be removed. Wheels may be lightly sanded to smooth out molding imperfections on the smooth tread area. This light sanding is the only modification allowed.
 - g. Beveling, tapering, thin sanding, wafering or lathe turning of the wheels is prohibited.
 - h. The words "Official B.S.A. Made in U.S.A." and other lettering on the wheels shall remain intact and clearly visible to the inspector. Some of the original "tread marks" on the wheel face must be intact, i.e. apparent to the inspector.
 - i. It must be obvious to the judges that the grooves, wheels, and the nails from the original kit are being used.
- 7. The car must have been made during the current year (year in which derby is being held) Cannot use previous years cars Pinewood Derby Car kits supplied by the pack
- 8. Wheel bearings, washers, and bushings are prohibited.
- 9. The car shall not ride on springs.
- 10. Axles may be lubricated with dry powdered graphite or Teflon.
 - a. No liquid lubricants may be used such as silicone, oil, or grease.
 - b. Lubrication must be performed prior to entering building where the Pack races are held.
 - c. All lubrication must occur outside the building to keep the race location clean.
 - d. Once cars are registered for the Pack race, no further lubrication may be added.
- 11. Details, such as steering wheel and driver are permissible as long as these details do not exceed the maximum length, width and weight specifications
- 12. The car shall not ride on any kind of spring(s).
- 13. The car must be free-wheeling, with no starting devices.
- 14. No loose materials of any kind are allowed in the car, such as ball bearings or lead shot.

No modifications are allowed between the time the car is checked in for the Pack Race and the time it completes the District Race. Please make sure to follow the rules. Packs are responsible to make sure any car they are sending to District for the Speed competition adhere to all these rules.

A Scout is Trustworthy. If you are trying to find a way to follow the letter of the rules while ignoring the spirit of the rules, you're not showing Scout Spirit. Any car that does not meet the spirit of the rules when checked in at the District Race will be disqualified. The decision is at the discretion of the Trackmaster. There will not be an opportunity to make changed to the car if it fails inspection at the District Race. Please, do not put us in a position to disqualify a car.

Participants of both the design <u>and</u> speed competition are expected to be there for the entire event to show support for your fellow Cub Scouts.

District Race Event

- 1. The Pack's top (3) cars that wish to compete at the district race must be confiscated by the Cubmaster directly after the final races. The Cubmaster is to deliver the cars to the Track Chairman within 7 days of the Pack race. If due to scheduling conflicts the Cubmaster cannot deliver the cars within the 7 days, they are to contact the Track Chairman prior to arrange delivery. The cars should be labeled on the bottom with the scout's name, rank and Pack number. The cars should be delivered with a list of the (3) scout's names and ranks along with the entry fee. The fee should be paid with a check for \$6.00 per car written out to Bay Lakes Council. Please place the cars in one small box to keep them safe during transportation. (Baseball Card boxes make great boxes for safely transporting Pinewood Derby cars.)
- 2. The scout needs to be in attendance the day of the district race. If for special circumstances the scout cannot make the day of the race, the Cub Scout can contact the Senior District Executive to discuss the circumstances.
- 3. The Track Chairman will make sure the cars are on the track properly and then start the race. If the car is to be oriented (front/rear) a certain way that is not obvious, please write a letter F on the front of the car or mark with an arrow.
- 4. If a car leaves the track, runs out of its lane, interferes with another car, loses an axle/wheel, etc., the heat will be rerun. The car may be repaired as needed to attempt to complete the remaining heats (time limit of 5 minutes). If the same car leaves its lane or interferes with a car in a subsequent heat, the heat will be rerun, and the faulty car will be disqualified. Only one attempt at repairing the car will be provided. If a car leaves its lane, at his sole discretion, the track chairman may inspect the track and, if a track fault is found to have caused the initial violation, the track chairman may order the race to be rerun after the track is repaired with no violation assessed to the car.
- 5. Electronic timing is used at district events. The races are run using a computer that senses the car crossing the finish line. Each car will race in all 6 lanes track. When all races are done the (6) cars with the fastest combined times from each lane will be in the finals. The finals will run each of the 6 cars on each lane of the track.
- 6. All scouts will receive a participation award. Cars finishing in 1st, 2nd and 3rd will be awarded trophies.

Car Design with Electronic Track Timers

Be careful about the width of the front of the car. Narrow cars have been observed to be problematic with the type of timer that we have. The track timer uses an electronic photocell sensor or "eye" which may not "see" the car at the end of the race if it is too narrow. If the timing equipment cannot recognize the car, it will result in a last place finish for that car regardless of where it finishes.

District Creativity Competition (Judged Competition)

In addition to the speed competition a separate competition will be held to determine the "Best Design" cars. Best Design can reflect the most unusual/interesting approach in the car's design but doesn't need to be of an automotive theme (for example, a pool table, dragon, pirate ship, submarine, fish, campsite, etc.). Consideration for the District Design Award will include originality, creativity, and the percent of work completed by the scout.

- 1. Each Pack may enter up to three cars to compete in the District Design Competition. The Pack's registration form should include the scouts' names and ranks. The Pack will be responsible for including the registration fee for the Design competitors when the Race cars are submitted to the Senior District Executive. The fee is \$6.00 per car for the Design Competition. The cars should be labeled on the bottom with the scout's name and Pack number. Cars for the <u>Design</u> competition do not need to be turned over to the Senior District Executive and may be brought to the district event by the scout.
- 2. As with the speed competition, the scout needs to be in attendance the day of the District Pinewood Derby. If for special circumstances the scout cannot make the day of the race, the Cub Scout can contact the Senior District Executive to discuss the circumstances.
- 3. The car should meet all the requirements as previously stated in the District Rules.
- 4. As with the speed cars, the race car should be built with involvement of the scout. Cars clearly built by an adult will not be allowed to compete in the district design contest.

The judging will be administered by attendees of the district event. Once the voting has been completed, the cars with the most votes will be selected as the district champions. If a tie exists at the end of the counting, the District Pinewood Derby committee members will each cast a single vote to determine the winner for that category. Note: In the case of a tie, a committee member is not eligible to vote if one of the cars is from his/her own Pack.

All scouts will receive a participation award. The top 6 cars in the design contest will be awarded trophies.

A car can only compete in speed **OR** design (not both). This is done to maximize the number of individual scouts participating at this district event. If a car qualifies for the District Pinewood Derby for both speed and design at the Pack level, the Cub Scout will need to select which competition to enter at the district Pinewood Derby.
