GENERAL INFORMATION

- **Adult Leadership**

As with any Scouting event, Youth Protection guidelines must be followed at STEM Family Camp. All units are required to have a minimum of 2 adults. Cub Scouts units should have an additional 1 adult for every 8 Scouts, except for Lions and Tigers who are required to have their adult partner attend with them.

- **Alcoholic Beverages & Tobacco**

Alcohol and Scouting do not mix. The consumption or use, or being under the influence, of alcohol or illegal drugs is prohibited at any activity involving participation of youth members. We are in the business of setting examples for our youth. Tobacco use will only be allowed in personal vehicles in the Welcome Center parking lot. Anyone not following this will be asked to leave immediately.

- **Food & Equipment**

All meals should be provided and cooked by each unit, except lunch Saturday. Lunch provided will be a basic sandwich box lunch. If there are any allergies or nutritional needs, please note on your registration form. Troops who have Webelos camping with them should include them in the meal planning and preparation. Cub Packs should cook as a unit and include the Scouts in the planning and preparation of the meals. This helps the Scouts complete requirements for adventures. Be sure to demonstrate Scout Cooking Methods and Leave No Trace camping. Supplies for S'mores will be provided to each unit to enjoy on Saturday night following the Campfire.

- **Health Forms**

All Youth & Adults attending Spring Family Camp must have a completed Health Form parts A&B as these are required for any overnight event. Health Forms will be collected at time of check-in and kept on file with the Medic. All forms will be returned to the unit at check-out. Please include any allergies or medical issues the Medic needs to be aware of. Part C is not required but is encouraged.

- **First Aid**

The Medic will be camping at the Commissioner's Village. During the day she will be in radio contact with staff. All Scout Units should be equipped with standard first aid equipment and supplies. If there are any questions concerning an injury or a major injury, contact the Medic immediately.

- **COVID-19**

Due to the current health concerns with COVID-19 masks will be required in all buildings and any time the 6 ft social distancing rule cannot occur. Each person attending STEM family camp must complete the Pre-Screening form the day of arrival. Health forms, Pre-Screening forms and medical checks will be required before anyone will be allowed into camp. Medical checks will take place in the Welcome Center parking lot, please have health forms and pre-screening forms available upon arrival. Each unit will be responsible for taking daily temperatures for every person in their group. Units must bring their own thermometers, a log will be provided for recording. Please make sure that your unit is doing their part to keep everyone safe by staying home if you have any COVID symptoms or have recently been in contact with a positive case. Please wash your hands often. Hand sanitizer will be placed around camp in program areas, please bring soap and sanitizer for your unit's campsites.

- **Emergencies**

Please contact STEM Family Camp Staff during the night at the Commissioner's Village in case of an emergency.

- **Parent Volunteers**

Parents are welcome to accompany the youth to the activities, but this is not required. We would like to have 1 adult at each session to assist the Scout Trainers with any problems that may arise. If you would like to volunteer, please notify the STEM Family Camp staff after check-in on Friday. Schedules will be

handed out to units on Friday night at the Troop Staff meeting and on Saturday at the Volunteer Meeting. Each Unit will need a parent volunteer to help clean the shower houses on Sunday prior to check-out. STEM Family Camp staff will give them the supplies needed.

CHECK-IN & CHECK -OUT

Friday Night Check-In

- 5:30pm to 8:00pm
- Please no early arrivals, trailers are allowed in the camping area.
- ALL vehicles must be removed by 9:00pm (sooner rather than later is better)
- Participants must check-in as a Unit
- Late arrivals need to contact Thomas Yang Thomas.Yang@scouting.org with their name, unit number and the time they will arrive.

We ask that all members of the units gather at the Welcome Center and check in at the same time. One adult should be designated as the leader who checks in the entire unit to receive the STEM Family Camp materials and campsite assignment. Once check-in is complete the unit will proceed to the assigned campsite. Unload all gear and remove vehicles before setting up your tents. The road behind the campsites can become congested with cars so each unit will be allowed only 3 vehicles into camp to unload gear for the unit.

Program begins at 8:45 with flags at the parade field. We ask that all participants come to flags to begin the day of fun!

SUNDAY CHECK-OUT

- Inform staff on Saturday night what time unit wishes to check-out
- Begins at 10am
- Campsite needs to be cleared by staff

- Take check-out sheet to staff at Show-n-Do
- Receive Unit Health Forms, YPT Certificates and other Spring Family Camp materials for individuals
- Designate 1 Leader to complete check-out
- Designate 1 volunteer to clean shower houses

We ask that each unit have a volunteer to help clean the restrooms in camp. There are 6 restrooms at the Program Building, 2 at Cherokee and 3 at the Central Shower House. This helps the staff to complete the clean up of camp. We appreciate your cooperation with this.

Once the unit is packed their campsite will be checked to ensure the Leave No Trace principles are followed. A designated adult needs to check-out the unit at Show-n-Do.

WHAT TO BRING

Unit Supplies

- Water Containers – there is water available adjacent to the campsites
- Fire Containers – There are **NO** ground fires allowed. All fires must be off the ground or in fire containers provided. Ashes **are not** to be dumped in the trees. They must be extinguished and removed from the campsites.
- 1 Trailer per Unit will be allowed in the campsite.
- Trash dumpster is available across from Fisher Lodge to dispose of your trash. Please provide your own trash bags and keep your campsite clean. Remember your campsite will be inspected prior to departure.
- Cooking equipment – cook stove, utensils, cook pots, etc.
- Food for the weekend for your unit, except Lunch Saturday
- Unit flag – optional

Uniforms

- All Scouts – Field Uniform (Class A) must be worn to and from the event. Field Uniforms should be worn to flags Saturday morning.
- NO athletic shorts should be worn with the Field Uniform Shirt.
- Activity Uniform (Class B) is a Scout T-shirt worn with shorts. Is worn to Saturday morning flags for the day's activities.

Personal Gear

- Water bottle (NO GLASS)

- Rain gear – bring the gear or it will rain.
- Warm clothes – temperatures can vary widely in October.
- Tents (families will share tents with their Cub Scouts) Webelos and Troops should provide individual tents.
- Sleeping bag or bed roll
- Camp chair
- Extra clothes, pants, scout t-shirt, socks, underwear
- Jacket
- Pajamas or other sleeping clothes
- Mess kit and silverware unless unit is providing
- Washcloth and towel
- Personal hygiene items, toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant
- Flashlight
- Sunscreen and bug spray
- Day pack

What Not To Bring

- No Electronics (CD players, iPods, Radios, TVs, etc.)
- Any item not approved by BSA
