## Leon Valley Merit Badge College REGISTRATION DEADLINE: December 1, 2024

Event is open to both male and female troops from Leon Valley and Chisolm Trail Districts Adult leaders: YPT verification

**Time & Place:** The Merit Badge College will be conducted on the TAMUCT campus on Saturday, January 11. A schedule for the event is included in this packet. **Check-in 6 am at Texas A&M Central Texas University, Killeen, Texas** 

**Cost:** The Scout fee for the Merit Badge Seminar is \$40.00 (lunch included). This fee also covers an event patch, supplies, and facility rentals. Adult fees \$20 (including lunch and badge).

Classes will be filled on a first-come, first-paid basis—so register as soon as possible!

Merit Badges: A Scout may work on up to four (4) different merit badges from a list of approximately 22 merit badges offered. We have several sessions for some of the required Eagle merit badges to keep the classes smaller. All classes meet for two hours each on Saturday.

Leadership: Each Troop must have at least TWO (2) REGISTERED ADULTS, one of whom must be over 21 years of age. All leaders are required to have current BSA Youth Protection Training to be on campus with your troop at all times and supervising your troop while traveling.

Adult: Onsite training will be available. A computer lab/access to Wi-Fi may be available for all adult on-line training (bring a device if a computer lab is not available).

Uniform: All Scouts and leaders must wear their full Class A uniform for classes, meals, and chapel. A Scout-related t- shirt is adequate for off-times and activities.

#### **Event Information:**

**Step 1**. Review this packet in total. All merit badges will be taught by the following schedule:

Course A – Saturday at 7:30 a.m. Course B – Saturday at 9:45 a.m. Course C – Saturday at 1:15 p.m.

Course D – Saturday at 3:30 p.m.

When registering, please list the merit badge class choices in order of priority, 1<sup>st</sup> choice being the most needed or desired, and 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> choices the least needed or preferred.

- **Step 2.** Leaders must review merit badge requirements to determine if a Scout is mature enough to register for the class. Consider the needs of the Scout and the work, some of which may be necessary before class.
- Step 3. Scouts will be registered for up to 4 merit badges. Most merit badge classes take 2 hours of total class time.
- **Step 4.** Have the Scouts study the merit badge pamphlets prior to attending the Seminar. Some work will need to be completed before or after class and/or may have "time requirements". We will provide worksheets for the classes. It is recommended Scouts bring a notebook or folder for notes and class materials.
- **Step 5**. Register the Scouts and adults who are attending and submit registration form(s) and fee payment online to the Longhorn Council **no later than December 1, 2024**.
- **Step 6**. The Merit Badge College Staff will assign classes to all scouts and will try to register each scout with his or her first choice in each time slot. Due to the number of merit badge classes, we must schedule, and in trying to keep class size reasonable, some flexibility is expected. We do our best. Class assignments will be emailed to your **designated Troop Leader by Monday, December 30, 2024**. **BE SURE THE EMAIL ADDRESS IS CORRECT FOR THE MAIN CONTACT PERSON.**
- **Step 7.** Individual class lists and maps will be included in your registration packet to be picked up by a leader during registration. We will do check-in on Saturday morning so that leaders will have materials to review and distribute to Scouts and Leaders.
- **Step 8**. Attend the Merit Badge Seminar. The instructor for each session will have a roster to check attendance and requirement completion. After the event, the troop contact person will receive a list of Scouts and badges earned/requirements completed. *The Merit Badge College Staff retains the attendance sheet by classes*. **NOTE:** Remember, simply attending class does not guarantee a Scout will complete the Merit Badge.

Review partials and completions received after the event and help your Scouts complete any remaining requirements. Recognize your Scouts for their achievements! Completion reports will be sent to each troop within 4 weeks after the MBC.
