Registering for the University of Scouting



Class sizes are limited; please register early to ensure you can attend the courses you desire.

Registration is open to Adult Scouters and Youth who are ages 13 and above and achieved the Rank of First Class or higher.

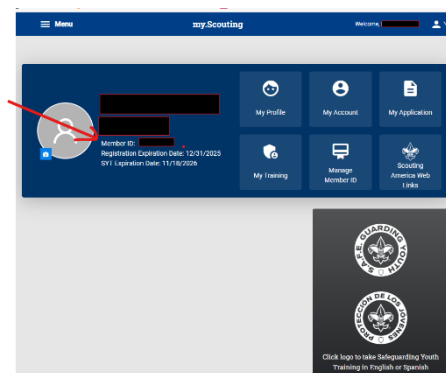

Breakfast/Lunch College

Starbucks next to Cafeteria will be open from 7:30 AM until 2:00 PM Lunch is NOT included in registration, TCC cafeteria is to open from 10:00 AM until 2:00 PM so you can purchase food from them. Optionally, you may bring your own lunch/snacks. Microwaves are available in the cafeteria area.

Attire

The University of Scouting encourages all participants to wear the complete Field Uniform of Scouting America. Due to physical activity and/or possible messiness, some classes may suggest you remove your scout shirt and wear your activity shirt. All clothing should be scout appropriate.

Check-in

All participants and staff must check in with the Administrations Team at the Registration Desk located near the cafeteria beginning at 8:00 a.m. Park in the parking garage adjacent to the campus (Cherry St. and Belknap), go through the doors on the floor you enter the garage (technically level 3) and follow that hallway (which they call "Main Street," technically on level 2). Walk past the Midway area and you can't miss us. We will have signs posted. Please arrive early so we can check everyone in before classes begin. We will be issuing wristbands for all participants. The Registration Desk will have staff on hand throughout the day to assist you with any questions or schedule changes.

Ordered 25th Anniversary Merchandise can be picked up at this time.

Class Attendance

Each class will take attendance using QR code and google forms with unique codes for each class. Instructions will be provided on the day of the event.

University Midway

Longhorn Council recognizes there are several companies in North Texas who work together with Scouting America. We have invited a number of these companies to attend and will provide an opportunity for you to visit, learn about their mission, and have an opportunity to learn about special product promotions. Community-based service organizations will be on hand so you may learn how you or your scouts may partner with them to serve the needs of the communities. Our Midway does feature prizes and drawings. Make sure you learn the rules and participate.

Guests and Children?

Guests are not allowed. All who attend the University of Scouting must register. There is no accommodation for babysitting, daycare or other means of looking after children. As a courtesy to other attendees and to prevent any disruptions, children are not permitted to attend the event even if accompanied by a parent or guardian. The only exception to this rule is those youth (13 years or older and Rank of 1st Class or above) who have registered as participants.



Degree Program

Longhorn Council is offering a degree program from the University of Scouting to earn your Associate, Bachelor, Master, and Doctorate degrees. To earn your patch, you must complete the requirements set forth in the current Degree Program.

Please feel free to complete this application in advance of the event. **The 2025 Degree Application deadline is 1:15 PM Saturday November 8th, 2025.** Degree Certificates and Patches may be picked up following the closing ceremony.



YOUTH DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

1. First time Youth - 13 years of age or older
2. Complete Four (4) credits
3. Visit six (6) Midway Booths

ASSOCIATE DEGREE REQUIREMENTS:

1. Adult Scouter or Youth attending second year
2. Complete five (5) credits
3. Visit nine (9) Midway Booths

BACHELOR DEGREE REQUIREMENTS:

1. Adult Scouter or Youth attending a third year
2. Received an Associates' Degree from LHC University of Scouting
2. Be a registered Scouter with current Youth Protection Training
3. Earn the BSA "TRAINED" patch for your current position
4. Visit nine (9) Midway Booths
5. Complete an additional five (5) University of Scouting credits for a total of ten (10) credits as a participant or instructor

MASTER DEGREE REQUIREMENTS:

1. Receive a Bachelor's Degree from LHC University of Scouting
2. Visit nine (9) Midway Booths
3. Bring one (1) new person to LHC University of Scouting to earn their Associate Degree
4. Complete six (6) additional credits as a participant or instructor for a total of sixteen (16) credits
5. Complete three position-related supplemental training courses. Examples include:
 - Cubs:** BALOO, Shooting Sports, Hazardous Weather, Outdoor Leader Skills for Webelos Leaders (OWL), District Committee Training Workshop, Safe Swim Defense, Certified CPR/First Aid course, Trainer's EDGE, and any American Red Cross health and safety course.
 - Scouts/Venturing/Sea Scouts/Explorers:** Merit Badge Counselor Orientation, Intro to Outdoor Leadership Skills (IOLS), Intro to On-the-Water Leader Skills (IOWLS), District Committee Workshop, Trainer's EDGE, BSA Lifeguard, Safe Swim Defense, Safety Afloat, Trek Safely, Climb on Safely, Tread Lightly! Tread Trainer, certified CPR/First Aid course, and any American Red Cross health and safety course.
 - Youth:** ILST, ICST, ILSS, Trainer's EDGE, BSA Lifeguard, Safe Swim Defense, Safety Afloat, Trek Safely, Climb on Safely, certified CPR/First Aid course, and any American Red Cross health and safety course.
6. Show you have completed one (1) of the following: Wood Badge Training, NYLT Training, Powder Horn, Seabadge, Conservation Weekend, Leave No Trace Master Educator, or Aquatic School.

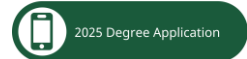
DOCTORATE DEGREE REQUIREMENTS:

1. Receive a Master's degree from the LHC University of Scouting.
2. Complete four (4) additional course credits as a participant or Instructor for a total of twenty (20) credits.
3. Serve as an instructor, faculty, or support staff in the current year's LHC University of Scouting.
4. Bring ONE participant to the University of Scouting that is working on their Youth or Associate Degree.
5. Show you have completed one (1) of the following: Wood Badge Staff, Powder Horn Staff, NYLT Staff, Leave No Trace, Master Educator Staff, Tread Lightly Master Trainer, Staff, Jamboree, Conservation Weekend Leave No Trace Master Educator, or Aquatic School.
