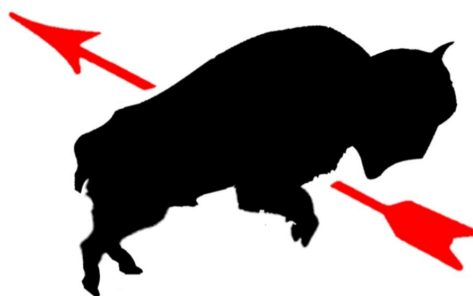

The Ordeal will take place in **ALL** weather conditions so be prepared! You must report in your official class A field uniform. Do NOT bring outside food or snacks: they are not allowed, nor in the spirit of, an Ordeal weekend. The fee for your Ordeal weekend is \$55 and covers your sash, lodge flap, Order of the Arrow handbook, annual dues, materials and meals.

## Guide for Brotherhood Candidates

**What is brotherhood:** From the inception of the Order in 1915, it was intended that all members should be of the same rank or standing. Brotherhood membership does not carry with it any degree of rank, status, or special privilege within the Lodge. Brotherhood is simply an act of commitment to future service in the Order and in Scouting. Brotherhood is signified through the addition of a bars above and below the arrow on the sash.

**Purpose:** Brotherhood is an opportunity for members to reflect on their contributions to Scouting and the Lodge, and reaffirm their belief in the higher purposes of the Order.

**Requirements:** After Ordeal, serve your Unit and OA actively for at least 6 months, advance your understanding of Ordeal membership, memorize the signs of the Ordeal membership, and complete the Brotherhood Test. The Brotherhood study guide is available [HERE](#).

Your weekend begins with check-in on **Friday, September 15th at 6:15 pm**. Do not be late and **do not** make plans to **leave before Sunday at 8:45 AM**. Plan on bringing the basic camping essentials for the weekend including:

## Medical Forms & Youth Protection

All Candidates must present their current Boy Scout Medical Forms part A & B (part C if available) upon check in. The Medical Forms will be kept secured but available in case of emergency and will be returned upon check out on Sunday. For your convenience, here is a copy of [BSA Medical Form parts A & B](#).

In addition, the Boy Scouts of America requires that all participants 18 years or older have proof of Youth Protection Training. This training must be taken every two years and is evidenced by a certificate of completion available on the [scouting.org](http://scouting.org) website or through a card/certificate indicating the YPT live training performed at council or camp facilities.
