



- In the afternoons, enjoy conservation and trail refurbishment that take you through the decades of the property!



Unit leaders will receive a spreadsheet at the end of the week with their Scout's completed requirements marked. Units can also print copies from Black Pug. Taking a merit badge is not necessarily a guarantee of completing the badge. However, if all the prerequisites are met, most scouts should be able to complete the badges they sign up for. Scoutmasters must approve their Scouts to take the merit badges they sign up for in accordance with National Policy. RSR Leadership will ask for the Scoutmaster's signature upon arrival to confirm approval.



I recognize the inherent risks involved in the riding and working with horses, including but not limited to:

- Bites, kicks, abrasions or contusions from horses
- Being thrown or bucked off of horses
- Scratches or other injury from stalls or enclosures
- Scratches or other injury from grooming, tools and other equine equipment and tack
- Allergic reactions to animals, hay, or other allergens
- Tripping in holes or on materials or equipment
- Slipping, falling, or otherwise being injured in the barn, in stalls, or on the grounds, which can be slippery, muddy, wet or contain or present other hazards

Owner acknowledges for themself or themselves, and acknowledges with regard to any minor the following risks associated with equine activity: (1) An equine has the propensity to behave in dangerous ways that may result in injury to the minor participant; (2) There is generally an inability to predict an equine's reaction to sound, movements, objects, persons, or animals, and (3) an inability to predict the hazards of surface or subsurface conditions.
