Here you will learn about ways to effectively communicate with your unit and community about events being held. Additionally, how to follow BSA guidelines regarding youth photos and use of BSA materials.

BSA Position Training – As we all strive to run a program of excellence it starts with getting your leaders trained. How do we motivate the busy working parent who devotes their free time to Scouting? Having parents interested in volunteering take training prior can also be a useful recruiting tool to gain their confidence in what the expectations are. Awards
