- 9. Fishing Learn basic fishing knots and skills, test your casting ability.

The Great Outdoors Camp is five days filled with fun activities where Cub Scouts have the opportunity to explore, learn, and complete rank requirements under the direction of trained staff. The Camp Director and Program Director have completed the Boy Scouts of America training required to safely run an accredited program for the BSA. FEES

- Cub Scouts are \$80 on or before 2 June 2024. \$95 after 31 May, 2024
- Tiger Cubs* are \$95 on or before 2 June 2024. \$105 after 31 May, 2024.

The last day of registration will be the 5th of June 2024. There is a cap for the number of Cub Scouts we can accommodate at camp. We will close registration once we hit our cap of 100 Cubs if it happens before our last day of registration.

Advancement

There will be many opportunities for campers to complete required and elective activities of the various BSA Cub Scout ranks while participating in Day Camp. Camp staff will keep track of the advancement and elective activities completed. The information will be returned to the pack and the parents at the end of camp to be transferred to the Scout's handbooks. No awards will be issued at camp.

ARRIVAL and DEPARTURE

Cub Scouts must be checked in at the beginning of each camp day and checked out prior to returning home each night. Those not signed in will not be able to participate in the activities of the day. Please note check-in times so that your Scout has sufficient time to sign in prior to opening ceremonies. Cub Scouts will not be released to anyone other than those reported to do so on the registration form. Attendance will be taken each day of camp and parents will be notified by camp staff if their child will not be in attendance. Please advise the Camp Director or your Den Walker in advance if your child will be absent. If a camper needs to leave camp early, please advise camp staff in writing. If Participants and staff feel sick, please stay home.

Health and Safety

The Health and Safety of our Scouts is paramount. We have received permission from local authorities to operate the camp and we will follow established health guidelines. Hand washing stations will be available throughout the camp. Equipment will be wiped down between sessions, scouts will be organized by dens, and we will promote physical distancing among staff and campers. If participants feel sick, please stay home.

Health Forms

All Cub Scouts must have Part A and B1&B2 turned in with registration. Shot records must be up to date; please make sure the date of the last tetanus shot is recorded. Your Scout will not be able to participate if the Health Forms are not turned in. Please note the exception on the consent form, if you do not want pictures taken of our child.

Medications

All required medications will be checked in at registration and maintained by the Camp Health Officer. Medications must be in their original containers with the patient's name, medication name, and dosage instruction on the label. (The exceptions to this rule are inhalers, Epi-Pens, bee sting kits, diabetes kits, or nitroglycerin tablets which must be carried by the Scout at all times.)



Emergencies

The Day Camp staff maintain a list of staff trained in CPR as well as having a Health Officer on staff at all times during camp. If an emergency occurs, the Camp Director will notify you. Please provide any emergency information necessary on the Annual Health and Medical Record. Please notify the Camp Director if there is any change to the emergency information after registration to keep the records up to date.

Special Needs Accommodations

Please contact the Camp Director if your Scout has special needs that we need to be aware of ahead of time. Boy Scouts of America promotes the inclusion of youth with disabilities. Each child is unique, and our day camp staff will work to provide the best experience for each Scout.

Refund Policy

No refunds will be issued. Noted exception is for family emergencies. In this case a written request for a refund can be made to the Camp Director. The Camp Director will forward the request to the district office for their consideration. Fees may be transferred to another Scout if requested by the Monday of camp week. You must contact the Day Camp Director to request a transfer.

Volunteering as Staff

Adult volunteers are needed to help our camp run. Our camp relies on parents and leaders, and we need your help. We have a variety of camp positions such as registration, class counselors, shooting sports instructors, Den Walkers, running the Tot Lot, and runner positions we need to fill. We are asking that each pack MUST provide 1 adult den leader for every 5 Scouts all full 5 days of camp. Youth Protection Training must be completed. Volunteers may work a ½ day, a day, or the entire camp. Volunteer and we will put you to work!

Den Walkers must attend the Den Walker meeting before the start of Day Camp to receive instruction and prepare for the day. Den Walkers must adhere to the same rules as camp staff. Pack T-shirts are recommended. Wear comfortable clothing and closed toe shoes.

Adults volunteering who have other children they must bring to camp have two options. If the child is potty trained and under the age of 6, they can register with the Tot Lot (see Tot Lot section below). If the child, boy or girl, is between the ages of 6-11 they can attend as a camper and must pay the normal registration fee. Youth Volunteers

Join us for camp by working as camp staff. Young men and young women 14 years of age and older may volunteer as camp program aids. In order to help with Shooting Sports, Scouts must be at least 16 years of age. Volunteering provides Scouts with the opportunity to lead, grow, and pass on the love of Scouting to younger Scouts. Scouts will earn service hours and provide a positive role model to day camp participants. If you are a registered Scout, please wear your troop Class b shirt or the staff shirt. Please, be aware that we cannot guarantee a spot to volunteer since we have to have a 1:1 Youth Volunteer and Adult ratio.

Camping

If you are traveling a long distance from out of your area to attend day camp, you can camp at Camp JET on Sembach base. Pre-registration is necessary, and base access can be given if you are not a DOD ID card holder. The campground has a bathroom available, but does not have showers. Camping is available from June 9th through June 15th. Please leave the site as you found it and clean the bathrooms upon departure. Camp JET is located behind the Sembach Post office and laundry mat.
