Advancement

There will be many opportunities for campers to complete elective activities of the various Scouting Cub Scout ranks while participating in Cuboree. Camp staff will keep track of everything completed. The information will be returned to the pack and the parents at the end of camp to be transferred to the Scout's handbooks. No awards will be issued at camp.

ARRIVAL and DEPARTURE

Cub Scouts must be checked in at the beginning of each day and checked out prior to returning home each night. Those not signed in will not be able to participate in the activities of the day. Please note check-in times so that your Scout has sufficient time to sign in prior to opening ceremonies. Cub Scouts will not be released to anyone other than those reported to do so on the registration form. Attendance will be taken each day of camp and parents will be notified by camp staff if their child will not be in attendance. Please advise the Director or your Den Walker in advance if your child will be absent. If a camper needs to leave camp early, please advise camp staff in writing. **If Participants and staff feel sick, please stay home.**

Health and Safety

Health and Safety of our Scouts is paramount. We have received permission from local authorities to operate the camp and we will follow established health guidelines. Hand washing stations will be available throughout the camp. Equipment will be wiped down between sessions, scouts will be organized by dens, and we will promote physical distancing among staff and campers. If participants feel sick, please stay home.

Health Forms

All Cub Scouts must have Part A and B1&B2 turned in with registration. Preferably the unit will have all attending youth forms from the unit together in one binder. Shot records must be up to date; please make sure the date of the last tetanus shot is recorded. Your Scout will not be able to participate if the Health Forms are not turned in. **Please note the exception on the consent form, if you do not want pictures taken of our child.**

Medications

All required medications will be checked in at registration and maintained by the Camp Health Officer. Medications must be in their original containers with the patient's name, medication name, and dosage instruction on label. (The exceptions to this rule are inhalers, Epi-Pens, bee sting kits, diabetes kits, or nitroglycerin tablets which must be carried by the Scout at all times.)

Emergencies

The Camp Admin maintains a list of staff trained in CPR as well as having a Health Officer on staff at all times during camp. If an emergency occurs, the Camp Director will notify you. Please provide any emergency information necessary on the Annual Health and Medical Record. Please notify the Camp Director if there is any change to the emergency information after registration to keep the records up to date.

Special Needs Accommodations

Please contact the Camp Director if your Scout has special needs that we need to be aware of ahead of time. Boy Scouts of America promotes the inclusion of youth with disabilities. Each child is unique, and our day camp staff will work to provide the best experience for each Scout.

Refund Policy

No refunds will be issued. Noted exception is for family emergencies. In this case a written request for a refund can be made to the Camp Director. The Camp Director will forward the request to the district office for their consideration. Fees may be transferred to another Cub Scout if requested by the Monday of camp week. You must contact the Day Camp Director to request a transfer.

Volunteering as Staff

Adult volunteers are needed to help our camp run. Our camp relies on parents and leaders, and we need your help. We have a variety of camp positions such as registration, Station Leads, shooting sports instructors, Den Walkers, we need to fill. **We are asking that each pack MUST provide 1 adult den walker for every 5 Scouts that do not have parents in attendance both full 2 days of camp.** Youth Protection Training must be completed. Volunteer and we will put you to work!

Youth Volunteers

Join us for camp by working as camp staff. Registered Scouts 14 years of age and older may volunteer as camp program aids. In order to help with Shooting Sports, Scouts must be at least 16 years of age. Volunteering provides Scouts with the opportunity to lead, grow, and pass on the love of Scouting to younger Scouts. Scouts will earn service hours and provide a positive role model to cuboree participants. If you are a registered Scout, please wear your troop Class B shirt or the staff shirt. Please, be aware that we cannot guarantee a spot to volunteer since we have to have a 1:1 Youth Volunteer and Adult ratio.

Staff Training

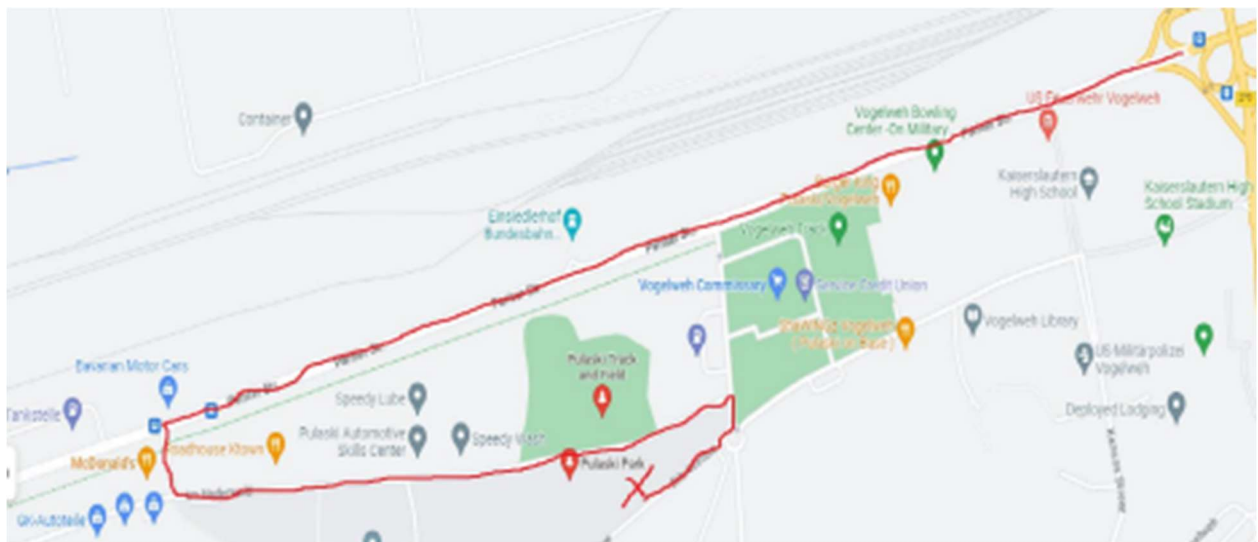
There will be mandatory training for all staff. It will be online and in person. Once enough staff signed up I will offer 2 Training dates.

Camping

If you are traveling a long distance from out of your area to attend day camp, you can camp at Camp JET on Sembach base. Pre-registration is necessary, and base access can be given if you are not a DOD ID

card holder. The campground has a bathroom available, but does not have showers. Camping is available from June 9th through June 15th. Please leave the site as you found it and clean the bathrooms upon departure. Camp JET is located behind the Sembach Post office and laundry mat.
