Overview

The Barbarossa District 2026 Cub Scout Spring Camporee, Ability Awareness, will be held Friday - Sunday, 24 - 26 April. The camporee will be held on Sembach Kaserne. Check-in will begin Friday at 17:00 and will conclude at approximately 19:00. Late arrivals or non-campers may check-in Saturday from 08:00 - 08:45. All cub scouts registered in the Transatlantic Council are invited to attend. The registration fee is \$20 per scout and includes all program activities and a patch. Siblings are welcome to attend. 1. General Information & Planning

1.1 Registration & Payment

1.2 Adults & Older Scouts

Both adults and older scouts are needed to help run Ability Awareness Camp to include checking in, checking out, program activity stations, and administrative duties. 1.3 Installation Access

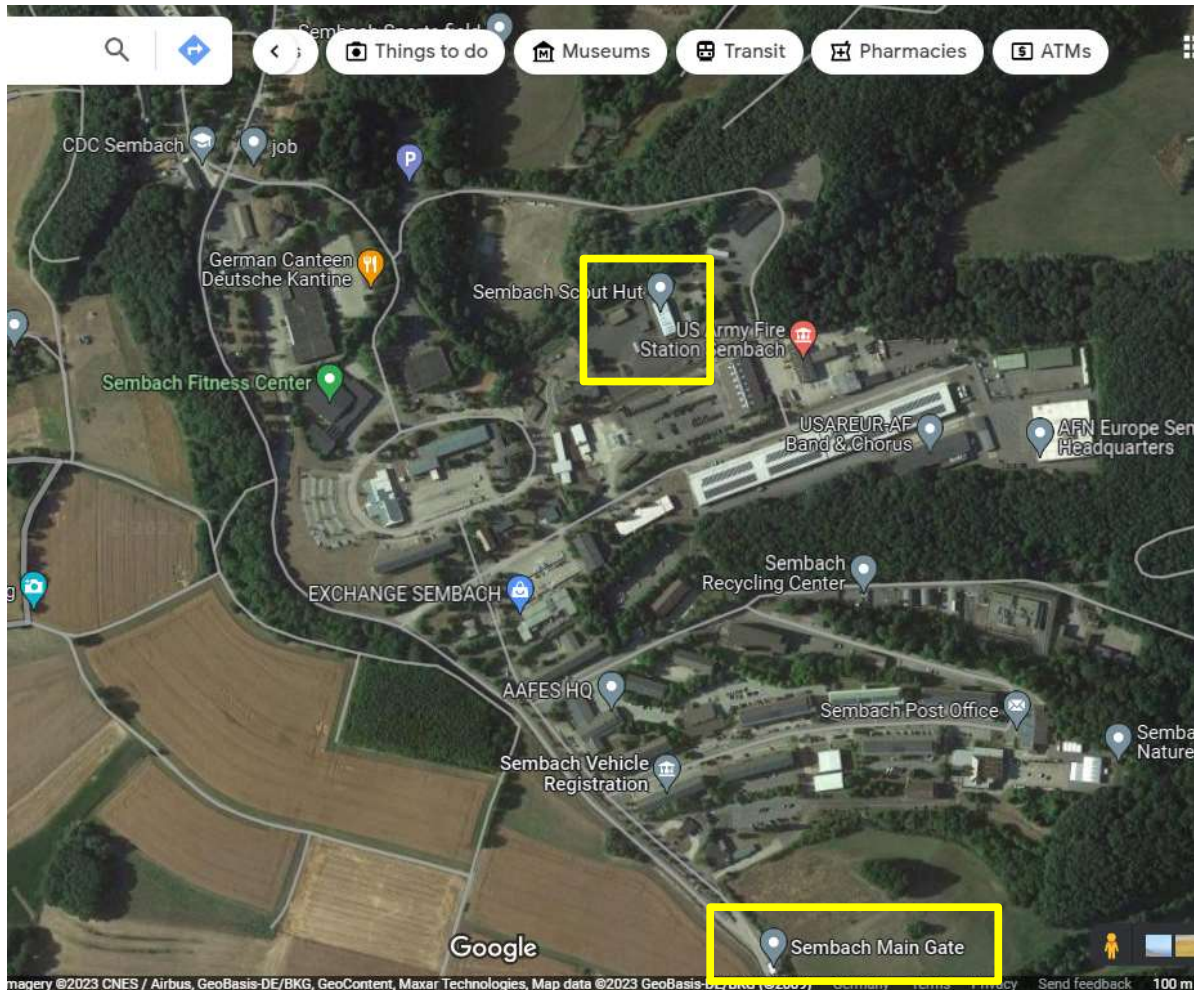
Installation access is required for Sembach Kaserne. All individuals needing installation access will be added to an access roster. Please indicate during registration that you need to be added to the roster. You must bring your passport as a form of ID upon arrival.

1.4 Camping

This camp is an overnight camp. Onsite camping is available. Unit sites will be distributed at check-in.

1.4 Getting to the Site & Parking

Ability Awareness will be held around the **Sembach Hut area**. The address for the Sembach Kaserne main gate is 67681 Wartenberg-Rohrbach. Signs will direct you to the location once you enter the gate. **Parking will be in a designated parking lot; no vehicles will be allowed around the Scout Hut as activities will be taking place there.**



1.5 Arrival Procedures

Units should plan to arrive between 17:00 and 19:00 on Friday, 24 April. A check-in area will be available where the unit's rotation schedule will be provided.

1.6 Trash & Recycling

Units should plan to pack out all trash and recycling as dumpsters and/or recycling bins may not be available.

2. Event Organization & Safety

2.1 Emergency Contact

It is recommended that all units have access to a mobile phone in case of emergency. This number and the POC should be made available to Ability Awareness staff in the event staff need to reach the unit. The event emergency POC is Joe Miller +49 15146366437.

2.2 First Aid

A First Aid station will be set up and prominently marked. Additional individuals with First Aid supplies will be available and wearing identifying apparel. If assistance is needed, please contact one of the Ability Awareness staff. If an injury occurs and if the injury permits, bring the injured individual to the First Aid station for medical attention.

2.3 Medical Forms

In case of severe injury or illness requiring emergency medical services or hospital treatment, a health history record and permission of a parent/guardian are required. The Medical Forms must be accessible to unit leaders at all times. Parts A and B are required for all youth and adults attending Ability Awareness. Please maintain all health forms in a binder and bring them to the event in case of emergencies.

2.4 Fire & Ambulance

In the unlikely event that fire and/or ambulance services are needed, immediately send a runner to the First Aid station so an emergency call can be placed and the event director can be notified. If the call is placed from your current location, a runner must still be sent so the event director can be notified and emergency services can be properly directed upon arrival.

3. Ability Awareness Program

3.1 Program Stations

Program stations will be a combination of scout skills, teambuilding, and fun all within the Ability Awareness theme. Units will rotate through stations throughout the day with a 45 minute lunch break.

3.2 Meals

Scouts/Units are responsible for their own meals. There will only be 45 minutes for lunch on Saturday so having a sack lunch is recommended as there will not likely be time to cook lunch.

3.2 Unit Sizes

Units will rotate as Dens through the program stations; however, larger dens may be broken down into smaller groups. Ability Awareness staff will work with units if there are any questions.

3.4 Gear List

Scouts should be prepared to be outdoors for the entire camporee so all Cub Scout essentials are a must. Units should also bring a small first aid kit.
