It's a great big world. You had better pack your map. Scouting is a great introduction to the outdoors, and a lesson on your place in this world. Let the adventure begin!




## YOUR GIFT MAKES AN IMPACT!

# 2018 Council Highlights

- ◆ The Transatlantic Council serves over 6,800 youth in Europe, Africa, the Middle East, and Central Asia. We have programs and Lone Scouts in more than 60 countries across three continents and 14 times zones
- ◆ 3,420 youth earned a rank advancement in 2018.
- ♦ Nearly 6,000 merit badges and over 1,522 advancements were earned by Boy Scouts. Cub Scouts earned 1,898 rank advancements.
- ♦ 119 scouts earned the rank of Eagle Scout and 167 Cub Scouts earned the Arrow of Light.
- ♦ The Transatlantic Council welcomed over 150 girls into the Cub Scouting program this fall.
- ♦ Over 650 Boy Scouts and Venturers attended a summer camp experience, either at Camp Alpine in Switzerland, Camp Volcano in Italy, or a summer camp in the United States.
- ♦ 600 Cub Scouts attended a Cub Scout Day Camp or Family Camp
- ♦ The Transatlantic Council has been named by the French government as Custodians of Omaha Beach.
- ♦ We have the best Eagle Scout to membership ratio of any council in the world.
- ◆ Scouts of the Transatlantic Council serve as American Ambassadors to local youth throughout our territory.

# Investing in the Transatlantic Council

The Transatlantic Council (TAC) delivers a top-quality Scouting program with unique geographic opportunities to open the outdoors, teach skills, enable service, develop leaders and citizens, and instils the values of the Scout Oath and Law to youth in Europe, Africa, the Middle East, and Central Asia.

To continue offering this to our youth, we need your help. The Transatlantic Council receives a modest Overseas Council Program Fee from each registration, but that only covers a small part of its costs. Funding from the US Department of Defense for TAC's budget has fallen from 70% to 29%. Meanwhile TAC has expanded beyond Europe to include the Middle East, Central Asia, and all of Africa, putting great strains on the council and its very small staff. To support each Scout, TAC spends on average \$250 more per year than it receives at registration. To guarantee TAC's future, every family that benefits from Scouting's outstanding programs needs to play its part and make an investment in Scouting.
