## Rebekah Weir Rotary Wood Badge Fellowship

Rebekah Weir was a dedicated Scouter and Rotarian. She holds the distinction of being the first woman in the U.S. to complete her Wood Badge ticket. The Rotary Club of College Park received funds from her estate and has invested these funds to create a perpetual Fellowship for a National Capital Area Council Scouter to have their Wood Badge fee paid. An annual competition for this Fellowship will be conducted to select the recipient. The committee will be from the membership of the Rotary Club of College Park and include at least one member of the Council. The committee will use the following criteria (candidates do not need to meet every single criteria): personal commitment as a leader of a Scouting unit in NCAC; unit will benefit from your attendance; Scouting history; need for funding to attend; and, to reflect the life of Rebekah Weir, Rotarians and diverse candidates are encouraged to apply, especially those serving youth of diverse communities in either organization. The winner will be recognized at Anniversary Meeting of the Rotary Club of College Park each June.
