PROGRAM ELEMENTS

DINNER:

Dinner will be a potluck dinner where the entire camp will eat together as one. Each Troop will need to cook a meal of meat and a vegetable as well as a dessert. Each troop will need to make enough to feed your entire troop plus one half. (If you have 10 then prepare enough food for 15). More information will be shared at leader meeting.

CAMP FIRE & Order of the Arrow:

When you come to the closing campfire please arrive in FULL uniform. For some this will be your first exposure to the order of the arrow. Will you be called out to join this group? Attend this event to find out.

CLASS SIZES:

Classes will be 10-15 scouts. Classes will fill up quickly, register now to ensure that your Scouts receive the classes that they would like!

CAMPSITES:

Campsites will be first come first serve on Friday afternoon after 4pm.

MB CLASSROOMS:

The teaching areas will be marked so Scouts will know where to go on Saturday morning. If counselors have access to a pop up tent, please bring so that you have protection from the sun.

UNIFORMS:

Field uniform also known as a "Class A" uniform should be worn at closing ceremony and at the campfire program. The rest of the weekend represent your unit with your troop's t-shirt.

POLICES & PROCEDURES

GUIDE TO SAFE SCOUTING:

Anyone participating in this event will be expected to follow BSA National Guidelines as outlined in the Guide to Safe Scouting.

THE LAW IS THE RULE:

Everyone is expected to abide by the Boy Scout Law, Oath, Slogan

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES:

This will not be tolerated and is against BSA policy. Possession or use will result in immediate dismissal from the event. Smoking: BSA guidelines require a smoke-free environment for our scouts.

PARKING:

Parking in designated parking areas only. Only one vehicle and your troop trailer will be allowed in your campsite.

GENERAL SAFETY:

Safety is of the utmost importance. Scouts will be expected to follow all rules and safety procedures given by the instructor. Horseplay and unruly conduct will not be tolerated inside classrooms. If a problem is to occur and safety guidelines are violated Scouts will leave the event resulting in an incomplete merit badge.

REGISTRATION:

The cost for the weekend is \$13-17 per Scout and \$8-12 per Adult dependent on the day in which you register, and includes: Camp Fees, Bathroom, Patch, General Supplies, and Leader SM/SPL Cracker-barrel.
