

Hello,

I'm excited to see everyone this coming weekend! At this time, Weekend #3 booked solid. It's going to be a great time!

Pam and I often spend much of the week fielding questions about the upcoming weekend and activities. Please pass the following information along to others in your unit and in your scouting community.

1. All Cub Scout events at camp are held rain or shine as stated on the registration page and the event flyer. Please come prepared with rain gear/umbrellas if rain is forecasted for any cub weekend. As a reminder, the event fee charged is for Saturday programming only. Camping is included as an option and is free. You are always welcome to come to any cub scout event for Saturday programming only.
2. Weekend #3 is FULL. Walk-ins and Saturday only registrations will NOT be accepted. Please let others know to not drive to camp if they are not currently registered. Please suggest that they register for weekend #4 as there are currently about 150 spots available.
3. Check-In on Friday is from 4:00 pm to 9:00 pm. If you arrive after 9:00 pm please find your campsite (posted on the list on the camp office door) and then go set up in your site. Come to the office Saturday morning beginning at 7:30am to receive your check-in packet and information.
4. Saturday Check-In begins at 7:30 am. You can check in any time after that, but you must check-in to get your wrist bands or you will not be able to do activities.
5. You will be given a "Passport" when you arrive. This will contain information about camp, rules, service and will include a schedule. PLEASE READ THIS as it will provide you with further information that is often asked while you are at camp. You can find a sample Passport on the registration page.
6. Everyone in your pack will be assigned to same campsite and schedule.
7. Upon arrival, you may drive to your campsite to unload your gear. Then you must move your vehicle to your assigned parking area and then go back and set up. This means, NO PARKING AT THE CAMPSITE!! as this is a safety hazard.
8. There is limited power in each campsite in the activity shelter. NO EXTENSION CORDS MAY BE USED EXCEPT FOR MEDICAL EQUIPMENT ONLY. If you must plug medical equipment in, you may use the outlets found in the activity shelter and pitch your tent next to the building so as to not have the extension cord create a tripping hazard.
9. Each Campsite has a bath house with 2 separate toilets, showers and sinks. Showers do have hot water.
10. If cooking your own food, you may use charcoal, wood or propane. Liquid fuels are NOT permitted. You must bring your own cooking gear - grills are not provided.
11. NO FIRES IN TENTS. Fires are permitted in the campsite fire ring of which there is one per site.
12. ALL FIRES MUST BE in the fire ring within the campsite. PLEASE ENSURE THAT ANY FIRE IS COMPLETELY EXTINGUISHED BEFORE LEAVING YOUR CAMPSITE. You will be sharing your campsite with other units. Please coordinate safety efforts with others in your campsite.
13. Please DO NOT STORE FOOD IN YOUR TENT. It will attract wildlife.
14. Please periodically take your trash to the dumpsters throughout the weekend as it will also attract wildlife.
15. CLOSED TOED SHOES MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES.

16. NO RIDING IN BACK OF ANY VEHICLE.
17. Pets, alcohol, firearms and illicit drugs are NOT permitted on camp property.
18. DINING HALL MEALS ARE LIMITED. IF YOU WANT TO PURCHASE MEALS, YOU MAY DO THIS DURING THE REGISTRATION PROCESS OR AT CHECK-IN UNTIL WE ARE SOLD OUT.
19. The Trading Post has a concession stand that offers pizza, hot dogs, etc. Hours of operation are listed in the passport.
20. BSA Policy states that SMOKING IS NOT PERMITTED IN FRONT OF ANY YOUTH (even your own at BSA activities). Please use the DESIGNATED SMOKING AREA LOCATED BEHIND THE TRADING POST.
21. We recommend you put your pack and campsite # on your children(s) wristband when you arrive in case you get separated.
22. When leaving your site at the end of your event, all trash needs taken to dumpsters, all lights and ceiling fans need to be off and all toilets flushed. Please coordinate to share this responsibility with other units in your campsite. Remember: WE ARE ALL CAMP, let's take care of it together!
