Big Is UoS Boy Scout Courses (Scheduled Classes)

BS101	9-9:55 AM		<p>1st Class Cooking (Dutch Oven Cooking)</p> <p>The Dutch Oven is one of the easiest way to cook outdoors. This class will teach you how to prepare and cook a variety of meals and desserts in a Dutch oven. This is a hands-on class.</p>
BS103	10-10:55 AM		<p>Boy Scout Board of Review (1st Class - Life Scout)</p> <p>A board of review focuses on a Scout's accomplishment and progress. The issues addressed can be about the Scout or the troop. The board of review is a chance for the troop committee to get a sense of how the troop is doing and to permit them to offer support where needed. Uncover the proper methods of conducting a Board of Review.</p>
BS100	9-11:55 AM		<p>Den Chief Training (3 hours)</p> <p>A Den Chief is a Boy Scout who assists a Cub Scout or Webelos Scout den leader at den meetings, pack meetings, and other events. He is the "Activities Assistant" for a Cub Scout den or Webelos patrol. Den Chiefs are a great recruitment tool. This course will train Boy Scouts to become Den Chiefs. Fulfills requirements for BSA Training C31</p>
BS102	1-2:55 PM		<p>Eagle Scout Board of Review/Timeline Paperwork (Adult & Youth) (2 hours)</p> <p>This class will teach everything that Scouts, Scout leaders and the troop advancement chair need to know about overcoming the challenges and obstacles in getting from the Life rank to Eagle. Completing the Eagle Scout application and the related paperwork requires attention to detail and good planning. Avoid errors which could cause delays. Know about properly completing the paperwork for Eagle. This class will cover the approval process for the Eagle Scout Service Project. We will also discuss the process to putting together the application packet for Eagle Scout Award. The third part of this class will cover setting up the Eagle Board of Review and the appropriate way to conduct this final step in the Eagle Scout Award process.</p>
