Thunderbird District – Three Fires Council, BSA

Location: Green Valley Forest Preserve - Naperville, IL **Cost:** \$17 per person (1-Scout & 1-Parent/guardian is \$34)

How to Register:

- 1. Go to www.threefirescouncil.org. In the right hand column under 'District Events', click on <TB Webelos Overnight>. When registering, please make sure you know your Pack #.
- Email or give a copy of your registration confirmation (and any separate paid receipt) to your Pack Coordinator along with <u>TWO</u> copies of <u>Medical forms (A&B)</u> for <u>EACH Scout</u> & <u>EACH Parent attending</u>. The Coordinator will then add you to the Unit Roster.

NOTE: CARPOOLING/Parking: Parking space is limited. Pack's will receive one (1) Parking Pass per two (2) families. *Let your Coordinator know who you are carpooling with.*
