Lunch:	Scouts will need to bring a sack lunch or arrange for food to be brought to
Requirements:	 See or read three full-length plays or scripts. These can be from the stage, movies, television, or video. WRITE a review of each. Comment on the story, acting, and staging. We will be seeing a short play during our day so you only need to do two of the above!
	2. WRITE a one-act play that will take at least eight minutes to perform. The play must have a main character, conflict, and a climax. (5 pages double spaced is about 8 minutes) This play must be Scout appropriate.
	3. Do THREE of the following: We potentially have time to do c, d, and e (bring a shoe box and a small makeup kit)

- a. Act a major part in a full-length play; or act a part in three one-act plays.
- b. Direct a play. Cast, rehearse, and stage it. The play must be at least 10 minutes long.
- c. Design the set for a play or a production of a circus. Make a model of it.
- d. Design the costumes for five characters in one play set in a time before 1900.
- e. Show skill in stage makeup. Make up yourself or a friend as an old man, a clown, an extraterrestrial, or a monster.
- f. Help with the building of scenery for one full-length play or two oneact plays.
- g. Design the lighting for a play; or, under guidance, handle the lighting for a play.
- 4. Mime or pantomime any ONE of the following chosen by your counselor.
