# NATIONAL YOUTH LEADERSHIP TRAINING

The NYLT course centers around the concepts of what a leader must BE, what they must KNOW, and what they must DO. The key elements are then taught with a clear focus on HOW TO. Through a wide range of activities, games, and adventures, participants will work and play together as they put into action the best Scouting has to offer. NYLT will be conducted July 14-20. Fees are \$265 when paid prior to May 15th, \$295 thereafter.
