Dan Kobler – Section C1A Chief

Dan Kobler is a past Totanhah Nakaha Executive Vice-Chief and was recently elected Section Chief of Section C1A. Our section covers most of Minnesota, North Dakota, part of South Dakota and northern Wisconsin.

Dan is currently attending the University of Minnesota. Dan will be updating us on the Order of the Arrow as it applies to the section, what being in the Order of the Arrow has done for him personally and in school.



Scott Miller – Eagle Scout, Many Point Director, North Wind Director

Scott Miller will be speaking about his experience growing up in the Boy Scouts in Maple Grove. He was an active member of the Order of the Arrow, served on the staff at Pine Tree Leadership Development Course (now known as Grey Wolf) for two years, and spent 12 summers working at Many Point Scout Camp in a variety of roles including Ethics In Action Director, Program Director, Camp Director and Camping Director. He also served as the Camp Director for *North Wind Winter Adventures* for the first four years of that program. In 2005, he went on a canoeing expedition lasting three and a half months and paddled over 2,000 miles, beginning in St. Cloud and ending where the polar bears live in northern Canada on Hudson Bay. Scott currently has his own massage therapy business in south Minneapolis and is in training to become a nurse. He will share the positive impact Scouting and the Order of the Arrow has had on his life and what the concept of servant leadership means to him.

Stephanie Hope Smith - Featured Speaker – Nobel Peace Prize Nominee 2012

Stephanie Hope Smith, Nobel Peace Prize Nominee will be speaking about her family's adventures in service that includes three winter Olympics, Disaster Relief at Ground Zero, creating a model for international service and helping mediate American Indian sacred site issues. Honored with the President's Lifetime Service Award for over 10,000 hours of service, Stephanie is a product of a family that was committed to scouting and to serving together, which lay the framework for how she has chosen to invest her free time as an adult. She will be sharing how giving two hours of service at a time has led to an amazing journey for her whole family and for thousands of young adults because of the unexpected ideas and new opportunities that opened while serving.
