Wilderness First Aid



<u>Cost</u>: \$45 per participant — includes food and lodging!

Why: This course goes far beyond what you may know as "first aid." Participants will learn how to assess, treat, and (when possible) contain emergencies within the scope of their training. Youth and adult Scout leaders over age 14 are invited to participate and earn their certification. While it contains substantial medical information and teaches skills required for medical emergencies in the wild, the deeper purpose is to train participants to manage acute situations. It can also save lives! All material included.

Finally, this course is required for at least one adult going on a High Adventure trip with their unit.

<u>Course Topics Include</u>: Patient assessment, Chest injuries, Shock, Head (brain) and spinal injuries, Bone and joint injuries, Infection, Hypothermia, Heat problems, Lightning, Altitude illnesses, Submersion incidents, Allergies and anaphylaxis, and Emergency Scenarios.

Let's Clear Up Something About Summer Camp Registration

We have had some recent conversations regarding the date as to when individual names are required for summer camp registration. Please be advised that we have updated the language on the website to read:

"Individual names do not have to be specified at this time but can be if the unit chooses to do so. <u>Note</u>: Individual Scout & Adult names will be required to be entered on/before April 4th."

This can be found on the <u>Boy Scout Summer Camp</u> <u>Registration Process Page</u>. The April 4th date obviously coincides with the start of merit badge registration. Since the "First/Last Name" is a shared field in Registrant Forms, we cannot set separate "due" dates for when the name is actually required so we went with the April 4th date. In summary, when units either confirm their current estimates or make a new registration for Boy Scout Summer Camp, they request the number of youth & adult participant slots and pay \$50/ per. They do not, at <u>this</u> time, have to fill in a name for the slot – The system simply creates a list of attendees based on their participant numbers:

Units will need to add names for both youth and adults on/before April 4th to make any further payments, additions, or select merit badges.

War Canoe Restoration Update

This January, members of our staff took over the shop at D-Bar-A Scout Ranch to restore yet another War Canoe. We believe this to be the last phase of a 4 year project to restore these historic canoes. This year's canoe was a challenge. After being purchased in 1961 for less than \$500 this canoe unfortunately fell into serious disrepair. Today, a new war canoe would cost several thousand dollars, but ours truly are priceless. This canoe had been stored at camp for several years before being moved down to the ranch this past spring. We look forward to its

return to CCB, fully restored in the coming months.

Restoring these canoes is a long and labor intensive project. First, the canoe must be striped down to the bare wood and sanded to a smooth finish. This step alone takes about 3 complete days. Repairing damaged sections of the hull and support structures takes the skill of a professional. Skip Gibson is our wood boat restoration expert. During the early stages of the project, he carefully inspects every inch of the canoe and manufactures a solution to every problem. Holes, rotting wood and cracked ribs are among the most common issues. Each one of these is different and could take several hours to correct.

Only after all of this has been completed can we begin returning the boat to its former glory, applying a minimum of 5 coats of varnish takes time.



Sanding between coats gives the inside of the canoe a beautiful shine. Every inch of exposed wood must receive the same level of care, ensuring that the canoe will be around for years to come. Lastly the outside of the canoe will be coated in fiberglass and painted, before being reassembled.





This is the 4th boat we have restored and the 3rd we will be returning to Cole Canoe Base. Last year, as a thank you for the use of their facilities, we restored one of D-A's war canoes. This project has involved several staff and volunteers, and countless hours of planning on the part of Senior Aquatics Di-



rector Mike Parsons. We look forward to scouts paddling this canoe for years to come.

New Boy Scout requirements for 2016 now in effect

It's officially 2016, meaning the new Boy Scout rank requirements I've been blogging about for months are now official. Where can you find the requirements, when must your Scouts start using them and what are the big changes? You have questions, and we have answers.

Let's do this.

Where can I find the new Boy Scout requirements?

The BSA has made it easy for you, providing <u>this PDF</u> straight from the new *Boy Scout Handbook* (which, by the way, will available soon).

There's also <u>this requirements insert (PDF)</u>, which is suitable for printing and including in a previousgeneration *Handbook*.

When do my Scouts start using these new Boy Scout requirements?

Think of 2016 as a transition year during which both the old and the new requirements will be used, based on the Scout's

joining date or his current rank on Jan. 1, 2016.

<u>I blogged about the transition</u> a few weeks back, but here are the basics:

The rank requirements are official as of Jan. 1, 2016. Scouts who joined the Boy Scouts of America on or after Jan. 1, 2016, MUST follow the rank requirements as printed in thisBoy Scout Handbook or in the current year's Boy Scout Requirements book.

Scouts who joined the BSA prior to Jan. 1, 2016:

Who are working on the Tenderfoot through First Class ranks MAY continue to follow the old requirements, but MUST convert to the current requirements upon attaining First Class.

Who have completed the First Class rank MAY complete the rank they are currently working on in the old requirements, but MUST convert to the current requirements for subsequent ranks.

Beginning Jan. 1, 2017, all Scouts MUST use the current requirements regardless of rank.

What are the big changes?

In the last few months of 2015, I did a deep dive into the new Boy Scout requirements. Click each of these below to take a closer look:

Number of required camping nights has increased Number of required service hours has increased Emphasis on physical fitness has increased

Scout is now its own rank

Boy Scouts are required to tell about their duty to God at each rank
