



The Pint Wood Derby Rules

A Corporate Pinewood Derby race is a metaphor for business. Competition sorts the weak and strong – the fast and the slow. Competition drives us to do our best. The goal of this event is to WIN and make your company look good. If you don't win, you can say the event was about having FUN.

Sportsmanship involves both following the rules, and how to compete in our Pint wood Derby. No matter how your car performs, you want to compete in a manner that will allow you to feel good in the days to follow. Why is it important to follow the rules at the derby? It makes winning fair and square.

The purpose of the rules is to provide a reasonable and level playing field for all racing contestants. Please read and follow all the rules:

- 1- **Only cars created and built from the Official BSA Pinewood Derby kit will be allowed!**
- 2- All CARS are encouraged to have a SPONSOR or organization's name and/or logo visible on the exterior of the car. This suggestion exists for ease of identification and also for media coverage and marketing of your company during and after the event.
- 3- The car weight shall not exceed 5.0 ounces. The official race scale shall be considered final.
- 4- The wood provided in the kit must be used. The block may be shaped any way that is desired.
- 5- The wheels supplied with the kit must be used, BUT can be sanded and shaped to make your car go faster.

6- The axles supplied with the kit must be used. They may be polished or lubricated.
