Some Cubmobile Details

The Event: The Fishawack District's Cubmobile Derby is designed to be more fun than competition. Drivers will race their cars downhill against one other car, with their lanes separated by tires or hay bales. Race times will not be measured. All registered Scouts will receive a Cubmobile patch.

Procedure: Racers report to the registration table upon arrival to be properly registered and receive their patch. They can arrive and leave any time they wish and can race as many times as they desire. It is extremely important that all racers follow the directions of the race officials and act in a safe and appropriate manner.

Cars: An example blueprint is attached. Cars must have close to the same dimensions as the car detailed in these blueprints. Cars must be equipped with (1) seatbelts; (2) steering mechanisms; (3) brakes, and (4) safety blocks to limit steering (see blueprint). Get the boys heavily involved in building the cars. That is a big part of the fun of the event.

Race Teams: Participants may share cars with as many drivers as they wish. You can designate your car as "anyone may use" or reserve it for your own use.

Safety Gear: Participants must wear helmets while riding on a Cubmobile. Helmets must be secured to riders' heads with chin straps. A bicycle helmet is an appropriate type of helmet. Participants will not be allowed to ride without helmets. Participants should wear bicycle type protective gloves, knee pads and elbow pads if available.

Food: Snacks and beverages will be available for a nominal fee.

Dress: Participants should wear Scout uniforms or pack t-shirts, long pants and sneakers or shoes. No sandals or flip-flops.

Adult Leader/Parental Participation: Each Cubmobile should be accompanied by at least two adult leaders or parents to assist and oversee the team.

CANCELLATION POLICY In all programs offered by the Patriots' Path Council, BSA, a great deal of planning and purchasing takes place well in advance. These plans include, but are not limited to, staff, food, program materials, patches and awards, rental and purchase of equipment, and in some cases, items of clothing such as T-shirts that are given as part of a program fee. When an individual or group makes a reservation for an activity or program, these items are included in ordering of materials and staffing for that event.

Refunds: Individuals or groups that cancel a program reservation 30 days prior to the date of the event will receive a refund of fees paid, less a 15% administrative charge. No refunds will be made after the 30 day cancellation deadline, unless there is a medical or other emergency.
