One block South of the intersection of US 20 & St Rt 534 or if traveling on I-90 get off the St Rt 534 exit and travel North on St Rt 534 approximately 6 miles which will be on the right. Some landmarks are: cross over RR tracks, go past the U.S. Post Office and the church will be on the right – if you pass the intersection of US 20 then you have gone too far North on St Rt 534.
