Who May Attend Wood Badge

Wood Badge is advanced leadership training for anyone registered with the BSA and over the age of 18. This includes adult leaders in all of Boy Scouting's program areas - Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, Sea Scouting, and Venturing - as well as council and district leaders. This includes assistant leaders, committee members, and "just parents" in all areas.

All leaders are encouraged to attend Wood Badge; there is no minimum tenure requirement.

Since it is advanced training, though, there are some important requirements. You must...

- Be a registered as an adult leader of the Boy Scouts of America and be active in a Cub Scout pack, Boy Scout troop, Sea Scout ship, Venturing crew, or a district or council position.
- Have not previously attended a Wood Badge course.
- Have completed basic training for the position you currently hold.
- Have completed the outdoor skills training programs appropriate to your Scouting position.
- Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment and have a BSA Annual Health and Medical Record Parts A, B & C, valid through the beginning of the course.
